

CD2022-0484 Affordable Housing Capital Program Community Development Committee 2022 April 27





#### Recommendations

That the Community Development Committee recommend that Council:

- 1. Direct Administration to include the updated Affordable Housing Capital Program, appended in Attachment 3, into the 2023-2026 service plans and budgets for Council's consideration at that time;
- 2. Approve a \$3.4 million funding transfer from the Southview project to the Rundle project in program P489\_000, funded by Pay-as-you-go, and a \$1.6 million funding allocation to the Rundle project in program P489\_000, funded by the Fiscal Stability Reserve; and
- 3. Direct that Attachment 1 & 3 remain confidential under Sections 24 (Advice from officials) and 25 (Disclosure harmful to economic and other interests of a public body) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* to be reviewed by 2026 January.




