To The City of Calgary Community Development Committee::

It has come to our attention that Council will commence considering the proposed western expansion of the Calgary Downtown Association at tomorrow's (July 26, 2022) Council meeting. We would like to register our opposition to this move and to correct some misconceptions about efforts by the CDA to effect this change.

Bullet points describing our opposition are in a PDF attached to this email.

We are actively collecting signatures from businesses in the area that oppose this idea. The signatures/petition will be made available later under separate cover, as we don't want signers to come under pressure from the CDA. While the CDA claims that they have engaged with business owners on this issue and that they have responded positively, our recent experience canvassing the area is that almost nobody knows anything about it, and they are certainly not aware of the fees involved or their non-optional nature.

The CDA is not disclosing the fees we will pay after annexation, going so far as to leave any info on fees beyond their mere existence off of their web page. Getting any information regarding fees and how they are collected requires navigating committee minutes at the City of Calgary website, so to most, this information is hidden, and willfully so. The CDA's communications director has gone so far as to assert that the City collecting fees on its behalf is tantamount to the CDA not actually collecting fees from business.

Our request for a meeting with the incoming President of the CDA has been met with an offer of a meeting in August, ensuring that any interaction with us would happen after the expansion is effectively a *fait accompli*. Frankly, the tactics of the CDA at every point along the way have been transparently obfuscatory at best and straight up dishonest at worst.

We would be happy to discuss this further with you either in person at the Loophole or by correspondence method of your choice.

- Our community shares little in character or interest with those now represented by the CDA i.e. The Core/Stephen Avenue
- We can be forgiven scepticism, given the several decade history of failed downtown revitalization schemes the CDA has been a party to
- We are building a community here on the West Side successfully. We do not require
 an intermediary between our community and the city. The CDA merely seems to
 have noticed good things happening in West Downtown and wants to wet its beak
- The CDA is focussed on the central core and Stephen Avenue, and its focus already dissipates on the edges of its current territory – should we believe this situation will improve by enlarging the territory?
- Our 125 is to absorbed into a body of over 2500 we will never have a proper voice or put someone on the board to represent our interests
- On the subject of the board of the CDA, it is populated by representatives of very large companies (Ernst and Young, Brookfield Properties, ARC Financial, ScotiaBank etc) – not a single 'small business' as you might conceive of one
- Equitable access to city services and infrastructure funds should not be dependent on membership in a group that exacts fees beyond the normal taxes
- The CDA is bringing a report to City Council at the end of July, asking Council to make us part of, and pay fees to them. This petition needs to get to them before the report is brought.
