Background

As part of the 2010 November deliberations on the 2011 budget, Council originally established the Council Innovation Fund (CIF). Administration was directed to develop Terms of Reference for the fund and create criteria that would guide Council on requests. On April 29, 2019, Council approved updates to the CIF Terms of Reference and introduced a new fund dedicated to community-driven projects called the Council Community Fund (CCF). The revised Terms of Reference for the Council Community Fund can be found on Attachment 8.

Context

Any Council member can submit an application to the Priorities and Finance Committee (PFC) for review and consideration, and ultimately for Council's consideration and approval. The proposal for funding must demonstrate credibility, fiscal responsibility and good management which will be important considerations in the evaluation of applications.
