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Thank you for taking the time to review my comments as a neighbour to this property. I believe in efforts to increase density within the City of Calgary, but also believe this should be done in a tasteful and community-appropriate manner. While I have not been able to review the formal plans submitted, it appears that there is interest in creating an EIGHT-unit dwelling on this single, oversized city lot. This is out of keeping with the surrounding area given the grade of the property and the dimensions of the lot compared to the building structure. It is also out of keeping with the elevation of the surrounding neighbourhood, and particularly the adjacent structures. While specifics of the structure height and building-to-land ratio are not available to me, it seems unlikely that an landscaping or outside score (refuse bins) would be possible.

I would likely be in favour of a FOUR-unit dwelling at this location, even if three stories in height, as this would be more in keeping with other higher density land use changes that have been approved (19 ave & 17A st SW; Richmond road & 20 ave SW; etc) but remain in keeping and context of the surrounding neighbourhood. 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The site at 1845-19 St SW is an exceptionally poor location for re-designation to RC-G. It is an irregular lot shape, without alley access to facilitate parking, access & storage of disposal bins.19 Street SW is treacherous in winter, it is a snow route, a pickup and dropoff location for school buses and parents, yet the developer, K5, would have driveways and parking onto 19 St., plus up to 24 disposal bins. The intersection of 19 St and 19 Ave is a dangerous, blind corner, not conducive to additional vehicles and further restriction of sight lines. infrastructure in the area has not been considered by k5, they have no idea the impact on water pressure, sewer lines and overhead wires required in this historic neighbourhood. Having lived within 2 blocks of the site for 22 years there may be locations suitable for RC-G, this is not one of them. Increasing tax base and wealth of developers is not a viable reason to increase density in inappropriate locations. Thank you for considering a different option.

It has come to my attention there is a request for a change in Land Use from RC-2 to R-CG at the above noted location.

While I welcome improvements in the neighbourhood, and support a certain amount of densification and variation in land use, I firmly believe the location in question is undeniably unsuited to R-CG zoning.

Of primary note is the fact redesignation would contravene a Designated Conservation Area.

The West side of the lot is directly across from Knobhill School, and a Scout Hall. The area is an accident waiting to happen with kids, parents, vehicles and school buses. It is my understanding there are currently NO approved R-CG lots backing onto a School Zone anywhere in the City. It would be an unfortunate mistake to set a precedent with this case.

There is no alley to help alleviate some of the potential issues that would occur on 19th Street with increased population, vehicles, trash, etc.

19th Street SW is particularly steep, and particularly dangerous in winter. It is a designated Snow Route. A route on which Calgary Transit and City garbage trucks are often stymied in their attempts to negotiate the hill. I would suggest this isn't an ideal situation for increasing density, and potentially further reducing visibility at the intersection of 19th Street and 19th Ave.

I have concerns with existing infrastructure and its ability to accommodate an increase in population density that would result from rezoning this lot. There are already noticeable changes to water pressure in our homes, as single family homes are replaced with side-by-side, multi family homes. Are sewer services up to the task? Will power and phone lines be taken underground, or remain above ground adding to the "squirrel highways" in the area?

Calgary recently adopted a Green Initiative. I cannot see how a change in zoning at this location would support that initiative.

All of these concerns have been addressed with the Developer. All of them were ignored as inconsequential, and of no concern to him.

I see no positive impact to the neighbourhood, nor the City, by rezoning this particular location. Would it benefit from a 'make over'? Certainly. And most certainly better done by maintaining current RC-2 status.

I encourage you to deny approval of the rezoning application.

Furthermore, the developer has not provided any intended plans to justify or warrant the application for the Change of Use. The City claims that its purpose is to "Make Life Better Every Day". It will fail dismally if this Change of Land use is to be approved and set a dangerous precedent in the neighborhood for more ill conceived developments. The City invites feedback from the stakeholders, please let it not be a mere formality. Please consider our valid and reasonable concerns for the quality of life we wish to maintain and continue to enjoy in our neighborhood. Re-development is a good thing for all communities and growing cities, but please, let it be respectful and beneficial to existing tax paying owners and community members as well as the city at large. I would like to speak to the decision makers about the lot not being rezoned just because of the fact that it does not have a back alley. Having garages and bins on a high traffic street with no concern for the school across with it, the pedestrians, parked cars and traffic going north and south past the lot on 19 Street without a stop sign. There is a stop sign on 19 Ave and 19 St SW with the traffic having to stop going east and west. When the traffic is going west there is no visibility for the drivers because of the orientation of the lot and the grade of the lot.

Every lot that I have seen rezoned to R-CG from R-C2 has a back alley. There are 2 R-CG lots on the map that the city sent with the Notice of the Public Hearing on Planning Matters. Both those lots have back alleys. I would like to show the council those lots and also the lots that K5 gave an example of lots that are on odd shaped lots. Those lots are a good examples of why 1845 18A Street should not be rezoned to R-CG. Two of the examples were M-CG (with back alleys) and the other 3 examples are flat, rectangular lots with back alleys.

The fact that this lot does not have a back alley is the main reason it should not be rezoned. The community members and myself that are against this rezoning are not against higher density but we are against a zone change that makes a location more dangerous for all traffic (pedestrians and vehicles). Thank you for your considerations on all the matters of this particular rezoning.

POLICY AMENDMENT AND LAND USE AMENDMENT IN BSNKVIEW (Ward8) at 1845 18A St.SW LOC 2021-0168 CPC 2022-0946. BY LAWS. 58P2022 + 155D2022

PROPOSED APPLICATION IS FOR A TOTAL OF 8 DWELLING ON THIS LOT (4 rowhouses and 4 secondary suites) which has been designated as RC-G from former RC-2

This proposal has multiple negative impacts and downside for the immediate area and the whole community. THE ONLY BENEFICIARY IS THE APPLICANT WHO WILL MAKE A LARGE PROFIT AT THE PERMANENT EXPENSE OF THE COMMUNITY. CITY COUNCIL AND PLANNERS SHOULD AIM TO MAKE THE CITY MORE LIVEABLE OR, AT LEAST, NOT LESS LIVEABLE AND FUNCTIONAL FOR PEOPLE LIVING HERE.

THE APPLICATION

- -8 dwelling units on an irregular corner lot.
- -8 parking areas which may be garages on 19 St.
- -24 garbage, recycle and compost bins on 19 St.

LOCATION SITE CHARACTERISTICS AND USES

- -there is no lane, Cars have to back out onto busy 19 St. with a grade and one steep hill. There is no space for 24 bins which would be on 19St.
- -Limited parking spaces for the proposed project means residents will park on the streets which are already congested. Potential for 16 vehicles at this site. NO CAR MEANS VERY RESTRICTED MOBILITY THANKS TO VERY LIMITED LRT AND BUS SERVICE.
- -substantial grades on 19 St. 19Ave and 18A St. and a steep hill on 19St at 19ave, and 2 steep hill on 18A St. at 21 Ave and 19Ave. (21 ave is one block from 19 ave, missing avenue)
 Traffic and parking would be made very difficult especially in winter.
 There is no snow removal just ploughs who pile up snow against parked cars and curbs.
- -19 St and 19 Ave. is a congested high use area with heavy vehicular, bike and foot traffic relating to the school on the next block, the medical centre, Mormon church Scouts hall, 19 St. is school bus parking,
- -Parking is already limited and heavily used in this area.

NEGATIVE IMPACTS ON THE NEIGHBORHOOD AND COMMUNITY

- -SAFETY OF KIDS WALKING TO SCHOOL, and pedestrians 19 stand 19 ave corner has limited visibility now and will be made much worse by the proposed 8 unit complex.
- -INCREASED TRAFFIC DIFFICULTY in a very hilly area especially in winter. MY VAN HAS BEEN WIPED OUT TWICE BY CARS SLIDING DOWN THE HILL INTO IT.

- -24 BINS CLUTTERING CONGESTED 19 AVE AND DIFFICULTIES FOR GARBAGE, ETC PICK UP.
- -PARKING NIGHMARES ESPECIALLY IN THE WINTER. Many properties on 19 and 18A St have to park on the street so parking is already a problem for many of us who can't park in the alley and have no garages.
- OUT OF CONTEXT FOR THE AREA. The proposed building is out of scale and will dominate surrounding homes, intrude on privacy, and cast one hugh shadow.
- -VIOLATION OF AN ARP WHICH DESIGNATES 18A ST, 19 AVE AND 19 ST. AS PART OF A LOW DENSITY CONSERVATION AREA.

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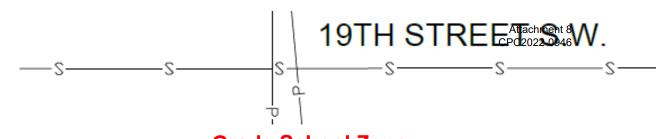

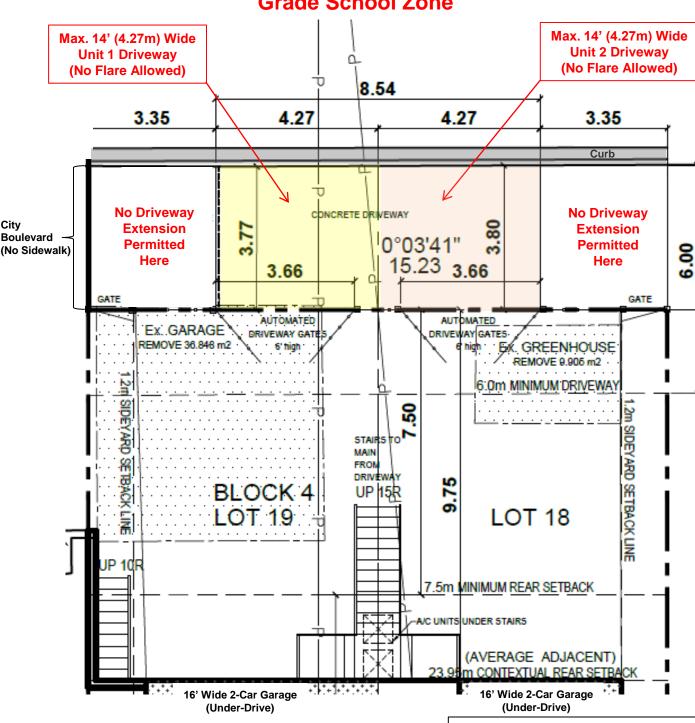

- •Currently re-developing the R-C2 site at 1835-18A St. SW.
- •Located 3 properties north of the Applicants land at 1845-18A St. SW.
- •Since this is the most recent re-development in the area, I thought that it might be helpful for all involved if I spoke about our Project.
- •An R-C2 Duplex will replace the poorly constructed, aging home that previously stood on our site.
- •In an effort to remain on good terms with the neighbors, the Duplex was designed to generally meet Contextual Guidelines (with a few minor relaxations) this respectful approach proved to be successful since no objections were ever raised.
- •Based on the ARP and the areas historic nature, we are building two single family homes that will compliment the neighborhood.
- •Although the design and Community Consultation process went smoothly, we did encounter some Land Use issues.
- •We faced site layout challenges since our property lacks a rear alley and is located within a School Zone – these issues may be relevant to the proposed high density R-CG Land Use Change application.
- •The City recognizes the traffic issues associated with rear driveways backing directly onto the 19th Ave. grade School Zone, and as a result we are not permitted to construct full width drives.
- •Instead our driveways have been limited to a single car width (Max. 14' wide), which will restrict access to our 2-car garages.
- Identical issues exist at the proposed Land Use Change site where the situation is further complicated because the rear of the property is located on a busy street corner (with a school X-Walk).
- •To protect school children, the City would also logically require driveway widths to be reduced at the rear of this location, which may prevent practical access to a "shared" 4-Plex 4-car garage (ie. 4-Plex "shared" garage driveways usually span the width of a 50' lot).
- •Due to unusual site conditions, careful consideration should be given to "shared" 4-car garage placement and 4-Plex driveway access issues prior to approving the high density R-CG re-zoning application.

As well, due to increased density there would be significant safety issues for the area as well as lack of parking and garbage bins. It also contravenes the Bankview Redevelopment Plan.

Dear Members of the City Council,

We write to register with you our opposition to the above-noted Application for change in land use from R-C2 to R-CG, LOC2021-0168. We support community members and surrounding neighbours in their opposition to this proposal and agree that their objections are well-founded.

Opposition to the Proposed Change in Land Use

The proposal to change the zoning to R-CG for this part of the community raises concerns from a planning perspective. The zoning change is to allow at least 4 townhouse unit type development on the site. The big problem is that the developer can also add 4 secondary suites below the units of no more than 45 sqm, and have no parking provided for them. This has happened almost everywhere this zoning has been applied and has had massive impact on immediate neighbours. We are concerned about this type of spot-zoning without a holistic assessment of the specific location characteristics of the site. Given the site constraints, the community strongly questions the appropriateness of the proposed rowhouse use for the site.

Furthermore, the lack of a laneway for this property exacerbates traffic and parking issues and despite more relaxed planning criteria, this site is likely best suited to a one or two-dwelling unit development. The parking solution for the site will be an issue with the steep nature of the site and the higher volumes of traffic along 19th Avenue. Motorists use 19 Avenue as a through route to avoid 17th Avenue, as is confirmed by the Bankview Area Redevelopment Plan ("ARP")¹. Moreover, Scarboro residents are using Bankview to access their neighbourhood for Scarboro's benefit. This negatively affects our community. The Bankview ARP underscores that "short-cutting of traffic through the community exists as a potential problem" (See pp. 26 to 28 of Bankview ARP – Supporting Information)¹¹.

We also note that much parking in the area is restricted due to the commuter parking there, as well as staff from the Medical Centre on Richmond Road. Vehicles will have to back out onto a busy street distracting other drivers from children crossing to nearby schools and Scout Hall. We concur with community members' request that a traffic study be completed as current traffic routing decisions have left the intersection of 19 Ave and 19 Street with a very high traffic volume, including both motor vehicles and bicycles. The Bankview ARP recognises 19 Avenue and 19 Street as being a particularly difficult intersection (See p. 26)¹. The traffic study should give specific reference to Scarboro destined traffic transiting through Bankview.

In addition, the zoning for this type of development has very little amenity space or room for any landscaping, greatly overlooks the adjacent neighbours' privacy, and allows for much greater massing than an R-C2 zoning. Potentially eight units or more is a huge increase in density from the previous one residence on the site.

This part of the community has several heritage brick homes from the original CP Rail brick masons (1890 to 1910), as well as several new single family homes on the narrow lots. The density is inappropriate, increasing massing and use, and will negatively impact an attractive and well-scaled part of the community.

It is important to note that in the Bankview ARP (Fig. 2, Land Use Policy on p. 4) the subject site and 18A Street area are designated as "Conservation" area. The ARP encourages the preservation and enhancement of existing dwellings, and redevelopment should be limited to one and two family dwellings which reflect surrounding developments (section 3.1.2 on p. 3).

In addition, the ARP directs that the topography of the land needs to be considered. It is relevant that the subject site has substantial grade issues. The Inner City Plan, a non-statutory policy plan that applies to Bankview and which is referenced in the ARP, also states that conservation areas should be preserved. The proposed type of density allowed under the proposed R-CG zoning would result in an intrusion into an established conservation area. In the community's view that will be a mistake. The Community believes the objectives of the ARP should prevail.

Request that the Administration Treat the Amended Application as a New Application

Members of the community became aware as recently as May 16, 2022 that the applicant wants secondary suites for this location. The applicant hasn't been transparent and made material changes to the application without community engagement. As the initial application package stated "Not Including Secondary Suites", the change in land use considered by the public, community members and the Bankview Committee in February 2022 was for 4-unit housing, only. As a result of this material change in the applicant's proposal, the Bankview Development Committee held a meeting on June 7, 2022 which determined that the amended Application ought to be treated as a brand new application for consideration. We would urge the Administration to do the same as the community and the public at large has not had an opportunity to properly consider and provide comments to the proposed change in land use for a development that wants secondary suites on each of the 4 dwelling units.

Request for Concurrent Development Permit Application with a Detailed Plan

We would also urge the Administration to request the applicant to make a concurrent development permit application with a detailed plan.

On October 14, 2022 Bankview community members, alongside members of the development committee, held a meeting with Kevin Ngo of K5 where community members expressed their concerns about the proposed R-CG change of land use. At that time K5 was unable to provide an answer, further clarification, or confirmation on any concerns. Specifically, as K5 had no overall concept nor detailed plan, including no engineered drawing nor any elevated design of what was envisaged, K5 was unable to confirm or provide further details to community members other than what was already stated on the application, this being that there would be 4 rowhouses with secondary suites.

The current land use proposal lacks planning merit as K5 is unable to address, discuss or offer solutions to the issues raised by community members.

Minutes of Meeting held on October 14, 2022 at 6pm among Bankview Community Members and K5 Design Concerning the Change of Land Use Application LOC2021-0168 from RC2 to RCG located 1845 18A Street SW

As the Applicant, K5 Design, had indicated at the CPC that it was not aware of the outstanding opposition to its application for the change of land use located at 1845 18A Street SW, the Bankview Community Association reached out to K5 to arrange a meeting, the purpose of which was to discuss Community concerns and get clarification on what K5 / the owner's plan is for R-CG use and how it sees that an R-CG development would be feasible on the property located at 1845 18A Street SW. The meeting took place at Bankview Community Hall however K5 attended by videoconference.

Attendees:

- o 23 members of the community
- o 2 members of the Bankview Community Association
- Kevin Ngo of K5 Design (by videoconference)

Minutes of Meeting

As the community members had not previously met K5 Design, Mr. Kevin Ngo of K5 was introduced and he explained that the owner wants to change the designation of the property located at 1845 18A Street SW to build four rowhouses with secondary suites.

Community members expressed their concerns about the proposed R-CG change of land use and K5 was not willing or unable to provide an answer, further clarification, or confirmation on any of these concerns. Specifically, as K5 had no overall concept nor detailed plan, including no engineered drawing nor any elevated design of what was envisaged, K5 was unable to confirm or provide further details to community members other than what was already stated on the application, this being that there would be four rowhouses with secondary suites. K5 did confirm however that the owner sought maximum density on the property so that she could maximize profit. K5 asserted that he was unable to confirm whether or not the owner intended to develop the property herself or whether she would sell the property once the land redesignation was in place.

The following community concerns were raised and left unaddressed by the applicant K5:

- How do you expect that eight units would fit together with the requisite parking and four rowhouses with secondary suites.
- o How do you know that a development with R-CG is even feasible?
- How is an R-CG with four rowhouses and secondary suites, parking stalls on 19 street SW safe?

As K5 offered no new information nor clarification of the plan for the redesignation, community members expressed that K5 and the owner gave them the impression their concerns were of no import. This also left community members with the understanding that the land redesignation was a 'fait accompli' or "done deal" regardless of what the interests of the current invested residents in Bankview were, without regard for their right to enjoy the peace of and present attributes of their homes and community.

K5 reassured the attendees that "You can fit four units with four secondary suites. It will fit." However, the community attendees remained unconvinced reasoning that the lot is irregular and is not a standard 50 foot lot. K5 confirmed that "one end is shorter than the other". Attendees reiterated that the parcel is not a viable lot for four units with secondary

suites, it is inappropriate for the surrounding area and it is unsafe to have R-CG at this corner.

One attendee asked K5 why it hasn't sought feedback from community members and why it hasn't designed something for the community to consider. K5 had no comment. Community members concluded that, without a detailed plan, K5 is not able to determine nor demonstrate whether R-CG is actually feasible.

Attendees asked what the owner's conception is. K5 confirmed that parking stalls will be placed along 19 Street SW.

Community members asked whether K5 or the owner is agreeable to an RCG(ex) (excluding secondary suites). K5 stated that the owner is not agreeable to amending the application to RCG(ex) and that the application is for R-GC to have more suites for profit to the owner (and not K5).

K5 was asked: "Why not apply for something you plan to get approved?" K5 did not respond.

Attendees expressed concerns about parking and traffic safety. K5 did not respond to this question as well. K5 had no comment as to whether or not the R-CG would be safe for the community, or not.

One community attendee asked, "Where will all of the waste bins to accommodate R-CG go, plus the parking?" K5 did not provide an answer.

Another attendee asked, "will the primary units have garages?" K5 confirmed that there will be detached garages on 19 Street SW which is across from the school. Community attendees explained that that is not feasible as visibility is currently an issue, and lack of safety for school children and others will be exacerbated. K5 confirmed that the owner is not willing to carry out a traffic study despite the lack of safety and the number of parking stalls envisaged at the corner, because it is not required to do one.

K5 was asked whether it had an elevation rendering of the proposed R-CG building. K5 confirmed that it does not and that it has no drawings. K5 said that a fourplex design is available on the K5 Design website but that these have not been built – they are only conceptual. K5 confirmed that there are two projects he has with the owner that are similar to what is envisaged here, he confirmed that they have been built, and K5 confirmed he will provide the addresses and design of these so that community members can see what an example would look like. K5 will provide details of these two projects having a similar profile, although he did not clarify what he meant by "similar".

One attendee asked: "Why isn't the owner present at this meeting, as the perception is that the owner doesn't care about the impact an R-CG may have on the immediate area and rest of the community"? It is not clear what K5's answer is to this question.

K5 confirmed that the community can appeal at DP permit stage only. There is no right of appeal at the R-CG stage "unfortunately".

K5 confirmed that despite the old infrastructure on these streets, no thought has been given by K5 or the owner as to the impact of R-CG on the current water and sewerage infrastructure.

K5 was unable to clarify whether the owner is planning to develop the property herself or whether she will look to sell the property after redesignation.

Attendees indicated that they considered that the owner and K5 did not take their opinion, concerns, or interests into consideration when applying for redesignation. K5 apologized that the community's interests are not being considered. K5 confirmed he would pass these concerns to the owner.

Community attendees concluded that the proposed R-CG presents "no upside or benefit to the community" and that "if eight dwellings can be built on this dysfunctional site, then it leaves the entire of Bankview open to any kind of development with no consideration for community residents".

K5 indicated that the upside is that it provides a new development where there is "more safety and security". Mr Ngo confirmed that "Four rowhouses will provide more security with the new families moving in. The current house is old and not good". Community members confirmed that we have no safety or security issue with current residents.

K5 confirmed that the R-CG redesignation is for profit maximization. K5 stated that feedback can be provided to K5 by sending comments to the details provided on the sign posting. However, Community members have since checked the signage which is a City bulletin and no K5 contact details are provided on the sign to allow the community or public to communicate to the Applicant K5 Design.

We are registering our opposition to the proposed land use redesignation from R-C2 to R-CG at 1845 18A Street SW.

In addition to the concerns detailed in the Community letters that were sent to Councillor Courtney Walcott and City Planning, our main issues are as follows:

- 1. Lack of transparency, information and engagement, with the community, by K5 Design and the property owner.
- 2. This designation change would exacerbate the overburdened traffic congestion and parking issues that already exist on 18A, 19th Street and 19th Avenue.
- 3. No Lane The property sits on 3 streets with no lane. A major throughway, 19th Avenue is a busy street with pedestrian and vehicle traffic as well as parked vehicles. There are no sidewalks on the east side of 19th Avenue. There will be 24 city refuse bins. Where do you place these bins for pickup?
- 4. Safety Issues the Calgary Arts Academy School (kindergarten to K5) is across the street from the property. There is heavy pedestrian traffic (school kids and parents) as well as school busses, school drop off vehicles, commuters, cyclists, and general daily traffic. There is a steep hill to the south and the corner of 19th Street and 19th Avenue has reduced visibility.
- 5. The redesignation would contravene a conservation area agreed by Council and legally designated by the ARP.

We appreciate your sincere consideration of the above problematic issues that the LOC2021-0168 application presents and kindly request that you reject the change of land use at 1845 18A Street SW.

My Name is Rosanne Yaskowich, I am the neighbor directly across 18A St. to the East from the applicant's property. I have been in the Residential Design and Build industry for 29 years and do believe that regentrification and progression within the inner city can be beneficial if approached correctly, but in this case, I must vehemently voice my objection to the proposed rezoning.

There are numerous reasons to why I am concerned about this property being rezoned to an RCG, and I believe they all have merit and require thoughtful consideration, they are as follows;

- Significant Densification Increase which goes against the community ARP
- Traffic safety concerns as said property backs onto an intersection with 2 apposing sloped hills with drastically reduced visibility as well as traffic congestion due to the school, Scout building, bike lane shortcut and commuters trying to avoid congestion along 17th Ave. (note said property does not have a back lane and RCG detached garage will back directly onto 19th St. across from the school yard).
- Parking is already limited, with the addition of staff members of the school and medical facility parking along 19th Ave. and walking up the hill to work, there is even a bus that is parked along 19th Ave. 5 days a week during school hours.
- The concern as to where 24 garbage, recycling and compost bins will be stored.
- The lack (neglect) of community engagement, misinformation and inflammatory responses from the applicant creating mistrust between community members and applicant.
- (2) historical homes located directly adjacent to said property which will be significantly impacted by sheers size of said proposed development thereby blocking all natural light.

I would be remiss if I did not share an exchange that I had with Mr. Kevin Ngo from K5 Design, where I was speaking to the concerns of community safety (ie: traffic at intersection) and his response was to indicate that "there is an old and decrepit house on this lot currently, 8 new homes would make the community safer". Not only was this response suggesting that those who live in old homes are less than desirable, it was insensitive and short sighted to say the least that I was concerned about future owners/tenants as it pertains to safety, which is simply not the case. Furthermore it is a clear indication, the K5 was/is not listening to the concerns of the community members, when suggested, "you will have a chance to voice your concerns during the DP process, not the rezoning". As you can imagine, this is terribly disappointing.

Inner City densification makes perfect sense in a major, progressive city such as Calgary, and I commend the City of Calgary (the City) for continually moving forward with its densification efforts. However, the City should decline this application re-zoning to R-CG, and allow the existing lower density R-C2 Land Use to stand.

I oppose this application for change in land use from RC-2 to R-CG.

The existing RC-2 designation is conducive to the established neighbourhood dwellings and contextually works for this particular parcel of land. This will be demonstrated in the 2022-11-1 Public Hearing presentation to Council by several residents of the Bankview community.

The existing, Council approved, **Bankview Area Redevelopment Plan** confirms this property is situated within a *designated Conservation Area*. Retaining Land Use RC-2 is in compliance with this designation. The potential outcomes of change of Land Use to R-CG, do not *conserve* the thriving conservation and integrity of the neighbourhood. The City has additional conservation efforts currently underway in Bankview through its **Heritage Incentives Area Program**. Recently, the City requested selected older home (pre-1945) homeowners in Bankview to participate in the **Heritage Incentives Area Program**. My 1912 home of twenty-two years, at 2104 - 18A St. SW is considered a "Heritage Asset" (character home), as it "substantially maintains its historic style, design and details" and meets the stated criteria to participate in this program. The intent of the program as described in a letter received from the City's Senior Planner, Ian Harper is "to encourage [property owners] to keep their heritage assets". My intent is to firstly discourage over-densification as not to deplete the contribution my heritage asset provides, and secondly to honour the conservation plans as approved by Council.

I oppose this application for change in land use from RC-2 to R-CG.

Inner city densification is an opportunity for a progressive approach to beautifying an established built environment. I support it when approached mindfully, in recognition of established dwellings and unique, contextual property features.

I oppose the above-noted application for land redesignation to R-CG because it is an inappropriate use of this property. This property suits a semi-detached dwelling with secondary suites at most. R-CG should not be adopted for the following reasons:

- Lack of transparency and engagement of the applicant
- Drastic densification having a negative impact in a conservation area
- Worsens the overburdened traffic and parking issues everywhere
- No lane exists
- It contravenes a conservation area agreed by Council and by the Bankview ARP
- Hugely negative affect on me as we live in the heritage home just next door

Lack of transparency and engagement of the applicant. The applicant has not engaged with the community and mislead it in thinking secondary suites were not included. Despite being in the business of development, the applicant K5 Design's only attempt to communicate with neighbours was to place a sign on the property on January 30, 2022 informing those who noticed it of this application for R-CG. The Community gave feedback to the City on the basis of the application which stated secondary suites were "not included". After the date for comments to the City had passed, K5 then made it clear that it wanted secondary suites after all. Since the Community had therefore lost the opportunity to comment on the secondary suites aspect of the application, the Bankview Development Community arranged a second meeting to discuss, yet K5 did not show.

At the Calgary Planning Commission Meeting, K5 was apparently unaware of any community opposition. The Community Association therefore contacted K5 requesting a meeting to understand their overall plan. K5 agreed yet appeared virtually while 25 community members with questions gathered. See attached minutes of the meeting which demonstrates K5's / the property owner's disregard for the Community's interests and their lack of any overall concept or plans. Community members have requested a concurrent development permit application with plans throughout so that they could understand how R-CG is feasible. It's clear that the applicant / owner have not seriously considered whether R-CG is truly appropriate for this particular parcel. It's not.

As a result of their disinterest and blatant disregard for the Community, and the ensuing lack of trust, the Community view is that the applicant has given no thought toward making the proposed R-CG building complex congruent with the surrounding area and has not considered the impact, including the massive density increase, safety, traffic, parking, management of multiple bins, lack of laneway, and serious gradient challenges and irregular dimensions that this parcel presents. The Community has not seen any plans of what the owner intends to develop, if she does.

Drastic densification having a negative impact in a conservation area. A building with this proposed zoning change and new rules about secondary suites allows for a massive change in density from 15 units per hectare to 150 units (counting secondary suites). A change in land use here will dominate surrounding homes, leave very little amenity space, no room for landscaping, and allow for reduction in setbacks, increased height, much greater site coverage, parking relaxations, garbage issues, privacy overlooking, all overwhelming the smaller neighbours in the surrounding conservation R2 lots and adjacent. The diversity and desirability of Bankview is at stake with such poorly considered over densification.

Worsened parking issues. The subject property is situated on 19 Avenue SW and 19 Street SW, which is already congested with high volumes of traffic and restricted parking. Part of 19 Avenue is reserved for school buses, part of it is zoned solely for residents on that street and the rest is designated 2 hour parking. A building with 8 dwellings at this corner will create increased safety issues and increase congestion street parking demand.

Overburdened traffic on 19 St and 19 Ave SW. R-CG here would exacerbate the overburdened traffic and parking issues we already have. These streets do not have the capacity for yet more vehicles and an 8-unit building would create even greater safety issues, particularly at this dangerous corner. Vehicles coming from the subject property would need to back out onto the corner into heavy traffic, right where school children cross and the 24 waste bins from the subject property would be situated. The corner is already unsafe due to poor visibility and the steep hills approaching from the south and west, heavy pedestrian, bicycle and vehicular traffic. 19 Street serves as a bicycle route for commuters every morning and evening.

No lane. The subject property sits at three streets. Neither one of them is a lane. Residents currently place waste, recycle and garden refuse bins onto 19 Street SW for garbage disposal pick up. An R-CG development at this site is entirely inappropriate.

R-CG detrimental to adjacent neighbours. Being next door, in an original brick masons heritage home built in the early 1900s, with the subject property to the south, an R-CG development means a loss of most of the attributes that this heritage home has. An R-CG development will dominate surrounding homes, leave very little amenity space, no room for landscaping, and allow for reduction in setbacks, increased height, much greater site coverage, parking relaxations, garbage issues, privacy overlooking, all overwhelming this home and the smaller neighbours in the surrounding conservation R2 lots. We will be living in the shadow of a monstrosity. Literally. Considering the lack of interest in the community's concerns, we have no confidence that an R-CG development will be thoughtful, congruent with the surrounds, or pleasing to live with. A notice of the public hearing was received the same day that notice of a meeting about preserving heritage homes was received, both from the City. While heritage homeowners are requested to maintain and preserve these homes, it is a contradiction to then be installing developments that destroy the very aspects that make them enjoyable.

I and others in the Community support development that demonstrates a properly thought through detailed plan. The current land use proposal lacks planning merit or any thought whatsoever.

I appreciate your sincere consideration of the above problematic issues that the proposed R-CG redesignation presents, and I urge each of you to reject it in its entirety.

Minutes of Meeting held on October 14, 2022 at 6pm among Bankview Community Members and K5 Design Concerning the Change of Land Use Application LOC2021-0168 from RC2 to RCG located 1845 18A Street SW

As the Applicant, K5 Design, had indicated at the CPC that it was not aware of the outstanding opposition to its application for the change of land use located at 1845 18A Street SW, the Bankview Community Association reached out to K5 to arrange a meeting, the purpose of which was to discuss Community concerns and get clarification on what K5 / the owner's plan is for R-CG use and how it sees that an R-CG development would be feasible on the property located at 1845 18A Street SW. The meeting took place at Bankview Community Hall however K5 attended by videoconference.

Attendees:

- o 23 members of the community
- o 2 members of the Bankview Community Association
- o Kevin Ngo of K5 Design (by videoconference)

Minutes of Meeting

As the community members had not previously met K5 Design, Mr. Kevin Ngo of K5 was introduced and he explained that the owner wants to change the designation of the property located at 1845 18A Street SW to build four rowhouses with secondary suites.

Community members expressed their concerns about the proposed R-CG change of land use and K5 was not willing or unable to provide an answer, further clarification, or confirmation on any of these concerns. Specifically, as K5 had no overall concept nor detailed plan, including no engineered drawing nor any elevated design of what was envisaged, K5 was unable to confirm or provide further details to community members other than what was already stated on the application, this being that there would be four rowhouses with secondary suites. K5 did confirm however that the owner sought maximum density on the property so that she

could maximize profit. K5 asserted that he was unable to confirm whether or not the owner intended to develop the property herself or whether she would sell the property once the land redesignation was in place.

The following community concerns were raised and left unaddressed by the applicant K5:

- How do you expect that eight units would fit together with the requisite parking and four rowhouses with secondary suites.
- o How do you know that a development with R-CG is even feasible?
- o How is an R-CG with four rowhouses and secondary suites, parking stalls on 19 street SW safe?

As K5 offered no new information nor clarification of the plan for the redesignation, community members expressed that K5 and the owner gave them the impression their concerns were of no import. This also left community members with the understanding that the land redesignation was a 'fait accompli' or "done deal" regardless of what the interests of the current invested residents in Bankview were, without regard for their right to enjoy the peace of and present attributes of their homes and community.

K5 reassured the attendees that "You can fit four units with four secondary suites. It will fit." However, the community attendees remained unconvinced reasoning that the lot is irregular and is not a standard 50 foot lot. K5 confirmed that "one end is shorter than the

other". Attendees reiterated that the parcel is not a viable lot for four units with secondary suites, it is inappropriate for the surrounding area and it is unsafe to have R-CG at this corner.

One attendee asked K5 why it hasn't sought feedback from community members and why it hasn't designed something for the community to consider. K5 had no comment. Community members concluded that, without a detailed plan, K5 is not able to determine nor demonstrate whether R-CG is actually feasible.

Attendees asked what the owner's conception is. K5 confirmed that parking stalls will be placed along 19 Street SW.

Community members asked whether K_5 or the owner is agreeable to an RCG(ex) (excluding secondary suites). K_5 stated that the owner is not agreeable to amending the application to RCG(ex) and that the application is for R-GC to have more suites for profit to the owner (and not K_5).

K5 was asked: "Why not apply for something you plan to get approved?" K5 did not respond. Attendees expressed concerns about parking and traffic safety. K5 did not respond to this question as well. K5 had no comment as to whether or not the R-CG would be safe for the community, or not.

One community attendee asked, "Where will all of the waste bins to accommodate R-CG go, plus the parking?" K5 did not provide an answer.

Another attendee asked, "will the primary units have garages?" K5 confirmed that there will be detached garages on 19 Street SW which is across from the school. Community attendees explained that that is not feasible as visibility is currently an issue, and lack of safety for school children and others will be exacerbated. K5 confirmed that the owner is not willing to carry out a traffic study despite the lack of safety and the number of parking stalls envisaged at the corner, because it is not required to do one.

K5 was asked whether it had an elevation rendering of the proposed R-CG building. K5 confirmed that it does not and that it has no drawings. K5 said that a fourplex design is available on the K5 Design website but that these have not been built – they are only conceptual. K5 confirmed that there are two projects he has with the owner that are similar to what is envisaged here, he confirmed that they have been built, and K5 confirmed

he will provide the addresses and design of these so that community members can see what an example would look like. K5 will provide details of these two projects having a similar profile, although he did not clarify what he meant by "similar".

One attendee asked: "Why isn't the owner present at this meeting, as the perception is that the owner doesn't care about the impact an R-CG may have on the immediate area and rest of the community"? It is not clear what K5's answer is to this question.

K5 confirmed that the community can appeal at DP permit stage only. There is no right of appeal at the R-CG stage "unfortunately".

K5 confirmed that despite the old infrastructure on these streets, no thought has been given by K5 or the owner as to the impact of R-CG on the current water and sewerage infrastructure. K5 was unable to clarify whether the owner is planning to develop the property herself or whether she will look to sell the property after redesignation.

Attendees indicated that they considered that the owner and K5 did not take their opinion, concerns, or interests into consideration when applying for redesignation. K5 apologized that

the community's interests are not being considered. K5 confirmed he would pass these concerns to the owner.

Community attendees concluded that the proposed R-CG presents "no upside or benefit to the community" and that "if eight dwellings can be built on this dysfunctional site, then it leaves the entire of Bankview open to any kind of development with no consideration for community residents".

K5 indicated that the upside is that it provides a new development where there is "more safety and security". Mr Ngo confirmed that "Four rowhouses will provide more security with the new families moving in. The current house is old and not good". Community members confirmed that we have no safety or security issue with current residents. K5 confirmed that the R-CG redesignation is for profit maximization. K5 stated that feedback can be provided to K5 by sending comments to the details provided on the sign posting. However, Community members have since checked the signage which is a City bulletin and no K5 contact details are provided on the sign to allow the community or public to communicate to the Applicant K5 Design.

Community members continued to express concern about this change of land use to R-CG as it is not appropriate to this particular site and surrounds.

As a homeowner residing at 1827 18A Street SW, Calgary T2T 4W1, I am not supportive of Application LOC2021-0168 to the change in land use from RC-2 to RC-G.

While I appreciate new development, it should be carried out in a way that is conducive to the character of this street, being 18A Street SW. This street is unique in that it has several single family dwellings on it and at least 3 of them are historic. I am concerned that rowhousing of four units means more big square blocks having no or little trees and landscaping in our neighbourhood. Trees and landscaping reduce noise and pollution and make it enjoyable to live here.

I also have concerns about the large amount of traffic and parking on 19 Avenue SW and the adjoining streets where the proposed 4-unit rowhouses would be built. The corner on 19 Street and 19 Avenue is dangerous due to low visibility, hilly slopes on all sides, and high traffic flow. My property is across the street from the Scouts Hall and I have often found it difficult to access 19 Street from my driveway because of congested traffic flow or because someone has parked in my driveway. I have the same issues on 18A Street. Both are streets and there are no alleys. A traffic study and a parking analysis on these streets and this area should be carried out before any consideration is given to changing the present RC-2 zoning. I am supportive of a duplex with trees and landscaping being developed in this location. This would be better than rowhouses that have maximized the square footage for profit.

After a community meeting with the representative for the applicant, it was clear that there is no development proposal in place, no interest in researching what would be relevant for this location, zero interest in listening to resident concerns.
