Summary of Inform Efforts Between Infrastructure and Planning Committee PC (Sept. 9) and Council (Oct. 4)

Actions to Raise Calgarians' Awareness and Understanding

At the 9 September 2022 Infrastructure and Planning Committee (IPC) Administration presented changes to Land Use Bylaw 1P2007 to address a Motion Arising regarding residential development using direct control districts, as outlined in IP2022-0989. Committee asked Administration to strive to provide Calgarians with more information and opportunities to better understand the proposal prior to the Public Hearing at Council on 4 October 2022. The goals were to:

- Inform Calgarians about proposed land use bylaw changes and how they will provide more housing choice in Calgary, where the new homes may be built and how they will fit in with the community.
- Increase understanding of how land use redesignation and development permit decisions are made and the land use decision making process for the proposed Housing-Grade Oriented (H-GO) district.
- Increase awareness of opportunities for public input on land use and development decisions, including how to submit comments for the Public Hearing at Council on the proposed land use bylaw changes.

Actions Taken by Administration From 15 September to 27 September 2022

Federation of Calgary Communities:

- City planners met with the Federation of Calgary Communities Urban Planning Committee on 20
 September 2022 to answer questions from Community Association planning representatives.
- An additional question and answer session was hosted by the Federation of Calgary Communities' Planning Coordinator where city planners answered questions from the community.
- o The Q&A video was shared on YouTube, by the Federation and on Calgary.ca/HousingChoice.
- Online: An "Ask Me Anything" session was hosted on Reddit in the r/Calgary subreddit to give
 Calgarians the chance to ask city planners questions about the proposed changes and have them
 answered in real time.
- Online media: City of Calgary social media posts, a Newsroom article and a Dispatch article provided an outline of the proposed changes and directed people to Calgary.ca/HousingChoice for more information.

Mail-outs:

- Approximately 6000 legal notification letters were mailed out on 12 September 2022 to Residential-Grade-Oriented Infill parcel owners and adjacent owners to explain the changes proposed.
- An additional pamphlet was mailed out on 22 September 2022 to Residential-Grade-Oriented Infill parcel owners and adjacent owners to explain the proposed changes in detail and in plain language.

Website:

- Calgary.ca/HousingChoice was updated with additional clarifying information and specific details to complement Residential-Grade-Oriented Infill notification letters.
- A comment form was added to Calgary.ca/HousingChoice to collect feedback and questions from Calgarians on the proposed changes.
- Newspaper: Advertising of the details of the proposed changes and the date of the Public Hearing at Council ran in the Calgary Herald on 15 September and 22 September 2022.

 Planning service desk: Information on the proposed changes was shared with planning and development customer service staff so they could effectively answer questions from the public through LiveChat, the in-person service counter, email and the Planning and Development Services call centre.

Providing Additional Information between 27 September and 4 October 2022

 - o A diagram on the decision process for Housing-Grade Oriented land use redesignations.
 - o Answers to frequently asked questions.
 - More photographs to show the types of development the proposed changes would enable.
- Federation of Calgary Communities:
 - A follow-up question and answer session was hosted by the Federation of Calgary Communities' Planning Coordinator so that city planners could answer additional questions asked by community members.
 - The second Q&A video was shared on YouTube, by the Federation and on Calgary.ca/HousingChoice.
- Outdoor advertising: 24 bold signs were set up to direct people to Calgary.ca/HousingChoice for more information.

Raising awareness about the Public Hearing on 4 October 2022

Administration responded to the public's desire to provide input on planning regulation changes and decisions. In all forums used to share information, planners highlighted the Public Hearing at Council on 4 October 2022 in which these changes will be reviewed, and it was advertised in the Calgary Herald on 15 September and 22 September 2022.

Summary of Campaign Reach/Impact
