# Recent meetings and events:

## Alberta Municipalities 2022 Fall Convention, AGM, and Trade Show

The Alberta Municipalities' 2022 Fall Convention and Trade Show took place from 2022 September 21 to September 23 in Calgary, Alberta at the Telus Convention Centre.

This was the first time in five years that an in-person Alberta Municipalities' convention was held in Calgary. Over 1,030 delegates attended in-person and another 13 attended online. Most attendees were municipal elected officials from across Alberta. There were also several Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs) in attendance (both members of the government and the opposition), along with Government of Alberta cabinet ministers and their staff, Deputy Ministers and members of Provincial Administration and all United Conservative Party (UCP) leadership candidates for a municipal issues forum.

Every member of Calgary City Council attended a portion of the Alberta Municipalities' 2022 Fall Convention. Three members of The City of Calgary's Administration attended. Mayor Gondek had two one-on-one meetings with Minister McIver and City Administration had meetings with their equivalates within Municipal Affairs.

The City of Calgary hosted a reception for convention attendees on the evening of 2022 September 21 in City Hall Atrium, organized by City Clerks. Mayor Jyoti Gondek, St. Albert Mayor and Alberta Municipalities President Cathy Heron and Municipal Affairs Minister Ric McIver all gave remarks. Over 300 delegates from Alberta Municipalities convention attended along with members of the Executive Leadership Team, and MLAs Leela Aheer, Joe Ceci, Thomas Dang, Richard Godfried, Irfan Sabir and Ministers Tanya Fir and Ric McIver in attendance.

Eighteen resolutions were submitted by Alberta Municipalities members, one was withdrawn (Expansion of the Temporary Rental Assistance Benefit), two emergent resolution were added (Victim Services Redesign and E2 - Hydrogen Industry Support). Nineteen policy resolutions were passed and one failed. The details will be attached when the transcript of this verbal briefing is uploaded (see pages 3 & 4 of this document).

The Alberta Municipalities' Board submitted three Special Resolutions amending the association's bylaws to reflect the organization's name change for Alberta Urban Municipalities Association (AUMA) to Alberta Municipalities. All three special resolutions were approved by the membership.

Sixteen education sessions were held concurrently over the morning of 2022 September 21 and covered a variety of topics from the environment, future of transportation, to affordable housing and the weaponization of social media. Convention attendees also listened to speeches from Alberta Premier Jason Kenney, Municipal Affairs Minister Ric McIver and the Leader of the Official Opposition, Rachel Notley, two Ministerial Question and Answer sessions, and a UCP Leadership forum.
