Phase 1: Response Phase

- Debris removal completed in all communities by Oct 17
- 23 Million kilograms received at landfills
- Parks, Waste & Recycling, Water, Roads, CofE, ESRD, many Contractors involved
- Approaching 10,000 SRs
- 1500 out of 7000 hangers remain

Cost Projection:

\$ 4.3M (Regular/Base)
\$18.0M (Incremental)*
\$22.3M (Total)

* DRP discussions initiated with Province through CEMA

Phase 2&3: Recovery & Restoration
