


"How do you rate the local government where your business is situated on: overall awareness of small business sector?" (Calgary)






#### Value-for-money of city services

# **CFIB Municipal Spending Watch**




Calgary's municipal operating spending grew 2.6 X faster than population growth from 2000 to 2012



### Controlling municipal wages


"How do you rate the local government where your business is situated on: controlling municipal wages?" (Calgary members)

Calgary municipal property taxes paid per \$100,000 of assessed value, 2012





## Policy recommendations:

- ► Ensure growth in municipal operating spending is held to sustainability benchmark
- Conduct formal spending reviews and zerobased budgeting
- Adopt sustainable wage growth policies
- Examine new models of service delivery
- ► Rebalance the property tax system to make it more fair for small business
