

Background and Previous Council Direction

Background

Through the One Calgary 2019 – 2022 Service Plans and Budgets, the City Clerk’s Office proposed to review the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board, and the Licence and Community Standards Appeal Board bylaws, and bring forward amendments to rectify any inconsistencies, inaccuracies, discrepancies, redundancies, and incorrect information.

Context

Section 13 of the Municipal Government Act states “If there is a conflict or inconsistency between a bylaw and this or another enactment, the bylaw is of no effect to the extent of the conflict or inconsistency”, therefore it is essential to ensure the bylaws are consistent with the provincial legislation. There were several bylaws reviewed which resulted in the proposed amending bylaws to the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board Bylaw, and the Licence and Community Standards Appeal Board Bylaw. This review is in alignment with the 2019 – 2022 Council strategic priorities of a well-run city and modernizing government.
