Introduction

At the March 10, 2014 Council Meeting, Council directed:

"The General Managers to canvass all their Business Units with regard to costs that would be incurred over the 2015 - 2018 business/budget cycle if the number of wards were changed and provide to the CFO for a report to Council, through PFC, no later than 2014 October 6...."

The following schedules summarize the anticipated operating and capital expense impacts for 2015 - 2018 of two and four additional Councillors, and was developed with inputs from all departments.

No increase included for general inflation or salary increases. Amount for 2017 has been prorated to mid-October.
⁽⁴⁾ Additional election workers for advance polls, hospitals, etc. where additional workers are needed to count ballots.

All Departments were surveyed for potential financial impacts associated with additional Councillors and indicated that, in addition to the costs included above, there would also be additional costs associated with increased engagement and consultation with additional Councillors. Due to the ad-hoc and non-routine nature of this interaction, these costs cannot be quantified in a meaningful manner.
