Background and Previous Council Direction

Background

The Calgary Transit Public Safety Citizen Oversight Committee (Committee) was established by a resolution of Council on 2002 January 28 (report C2002-02). The Committee consists of five volunteer members from the public and one professional standards inspector (an advisory, non-voting role) from Emergency Management and Community Safety.

As per the current committee's Terms of Reference, the purpose of the Committee is to:

- Review all public use of force complaints, after the conclusion of the investigation;
- Review all employer-initiated use of force investigations;
- Participate in use of force reviews undertaken by Calgary Transit's Officer Safety Incident Review Team: and
- Develop policy information and education related to use of force.
