In the past year, the Advisory Committee on Accessibility and the Access Design Subcommittee have had impact in the following ways:

# **CHALLENGES**

The following three challenges pose a risk to the ability of the Advisory Committee on Accessibility to fulfill its mandate:

 More fulsome education on the Access Design Standards within City Administration would allow the Advisory Committee on Accessibility and the Access Design Subcommittee members to focus their advice on instances that are not addressed within the Access Design Standards. It is a more efficient and effective use of the committee's resources to provide advice that falls outside of the scope of the Access Design Standards than to reiterate standards that are already in place.

Several projects have come to the Advisory Committee on Accessibility for approval which will not meet the Access Design Standards. Though the Advisory Committee on Accessibility has advised strict adherence to the Access Design Standards, it is disheartening to have The City proceed with inaccessible projects. In addition, advice has been sought from the Advisory Committee on Accessibility post-construction, which renders feedback ineffective. Incorporating accessibility at the outset of all projects would ensure that the Advisory Committee on Accessibility can focus on the future of access in our city, rather than correcting mistakes which could have been avoided with an accessible mindset at the project planning phase.

2. Knowledge transfer was a challenge with the Advisory Committee on Accessibility and Access Design Subcommittee given considerable turnover in their administration staff in the last year.

The Advisory Committee on Accessibility and the Access Design Subcommittee have experienced significant challenges due to the constant change in committee



administration. Each change has resulted in a loss of access features in our committee meetings and required an educational intervention, on top of existing committee work, to upskill our administrative support in how to provide an accessible meeting environment. We anticipate that we will be able to impact more change when we have more stable administrative support who have a more fulsome understanding of accessibility and disability inclusion.

3. Furthermore, there is concern regarding the decision to replace a knowledge-specialist with a generalist as the Administration's primary support for the Advisory Committee on Accessibility. It is felt that the City's commitment to Accessibility is not evident in this decision, and that the ability of both the Advisory Committee on Accessibility and the Access Design Subcommittee to complete their mandates will be compromised.

## **OPERATIONS**

In the past year, the Advisory Committee on Accessibility and the Access Design Subcommittee have met 20 times. Members participated virtually in all meetings except four, which were a hybrid format of both virtual and in-person attendance. Members of the public can request access to meetings, agendas, or minutes through contacting the Committee's resource staff. Administration is currently exploring additional methods to further incorporate public participation in meetings.

Each Advisory Committee on Accessibility meeting included American Sign Language interpretation and use of the captioning feature on Zoom and Microsoft Teams. In the future, it will be necessary to continue to host virtual or hybrid meetings to accommodate members who are immunocompromised and/or have accessibility challenges in getting to physical meetings. Large print agendas will be available for any hybrid or in-person meetings.
