DESIGNATION OF THE ROBERT AND MARY TAYLOR RESIDENCE AS MUNICIPAL HISTORIC RESOURCE

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Designation of the Robert and Mary Taylor Residence as a Municipal Historic Resource under Section 26 of the Alberta Historical Resources Act.

ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDATION(S)

That the SPC on Planning and Urban Development recommends that Council:

1. Refer this item to the 2014 April 14 meeting of Council, which will allow the owners to be eligible for a Province of Alberta heritage conservation grant deadline if this proposed bylaw is passed; and
2. Give three readings to the proposed bylaw to designate the Robert and Mary Taylor Residence as a Municipal Historic Resource. (Attachment)

RECOMMENDATION OF THE SPC ON PLANNING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT, DATED 2014 APRIL 09:

That Council give three readings to the proposed Bylaw **37M2014** to designate the Robert and Mary Taylor Residence as a Municipal Historic Resource.

Excerpt from the Minutes of the SPC on Planning and Urban Development, dated 2014 April 09:

"That the SPC on Planning and Urban Development recommends:

1. This item **be forwarded as an item of Urgent Business** to the 2014 April 14 meeting of Council, which will allow the owners to be eligible for a Province of Alberta heritage conservation grant deadline if this proposed bylaw is passed."

PREVIOUS COUNCIL DIRECTION / POLICY

The City of Calgary *Municipal Development Plan* supports the conservation and protection of Calgary's historic resources. The plan identifies historic preservation as part of good city building and community identity, and encourages property owners to conserve Calgary's historic resources.

BACKGROUND

The Robert and Mary Taylor Residence (address: 3423 Elbow Dr. SW; and with a short legal description of 7850AH; D; 7, 8) is listed as having "Community" significance on Calgary's Inventory of Evaluated Historic Resources.

INVESTIGATION: ALTERNATIVES AND ANALYSIS

Designation of the Robert and Mary Taylor Residence legally protects the property and ensures that any future changes and conservation work aligns with best practices in heritage conservation. The proposed bylaw is attached.

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Designation of the Robert and Mary Taylor Residence also allows the owners to be eligible for a Province of Alberta (Alberta Historical Resources Foundation) historic resource conservation grant and a grant from the City of Calgary Historic Resource Conservation Grant Program. The property was affected by the 2013 June flood and the owners are seeking to access these cost-sharing heritage conservation grant programs.

Stakeholder Engagement, Research and Communication

The owners of the Robert and Mary Taylor Residence formally requested Municipal Historic Resource Designation and agree with the proposed bylaw.

Strategic Alignment

The City of Calgary *Municipal Development Plan* supports the conservation and protection of Calgary's historic resources. The plan identifies historic preservation as part of good city building and community identity, and encourages property owners to conserve Calgary's historic resources.

The City of Calgary *2020 Sustainability Direction* sets forth an objective for Calgary to become a "diverse and socially inclusive city that respects its heritage and the arts," as well as a strategy to "support the preservation of Calgary's historic resources".

The City's *Calgary Heritage Strategy* (2008) recommends that identified historic resources should be protected by designation bylaws, when possible, to ensure their preservation.

Social, Environmental, Economic (External)

Social

Historic resources connect us to our past, our future, and to each other. They provide places of learning and places of understanding for all Canadians.

Historic resources are integral to the identity of our community and help to strengthen its distinctiveness. Historic resources add to the beauty, character and visual interest of our urban environment which contributes to the city's liveability and are sources of community pride.

Environmental

The preservation of historic places capitalizes on the energy investment in the original structures, preventing unnecessary resource use and reducing the pressure on landfill sites from demolition.

Economic (External)

The Robert and Mary Taylor Residence adds character and visual interest to the streetscape which makes economic investment in the area an attractive prospect. Designation will ensure these attributes are protected and the resulting security will promote high-quality investment. Also tourists and residents are attracted to areas with historic resources.
