The Calgary Aboriginal Urban Affairs Committee (“the Committee”) provides Council with professional and strategic advice on matters that affect Aboriginal Calgarians and offers guidance in relation to the implementation of strategies that advance Aboriginal interests in ways that benefit all Calgarians.

[The Committee’s Terms of Reference](#) set out its membership requirements, which include a minimum of 12 members and a maximum of 14 members of the community, and that at least 60 per cent plus one should be Aboriginal and include one Aboriginal youth.
