


Recommendation

Previous Council Direction



Fund & Project History

1914 – Mawson Plan shows direct connection from St.Patrick's Island to Bridgeland Riverside

1997 – Motion to establish Calgary General Hospital Legacy Fund

1998 – Terms of reference for the Calgary General Hospital Legacy Fund established

2000 – Bridgeland-Riverside Area Redevelopment Plan suggests "a new pedestrian bridge to St.Patrick's Island"


2016 - Terms of reference updated

2017 – The Calgary General Hospital Legacy Fund Review Committee was established

2020 – Bridgeland-Riverside Community Association applied to have the Calgary General Hospital Legacy Fund sponsor the feasibility study for the Bridgeland Riverside Multimodal Pedestrian Bridge

2021 – Fund revised to support capital projects

2021 – Up to 100% of the Calgary General Hospital Legacy Fund to the Bridgeland Riverside Multimodal Pedestrian Bridge was approved
