

Applicant Outreach Summary

Given the greenfield context of Cabana, Brookfield undertook a targeted engagement strategy by reaching out to affected stakeholders. Brookfield has worked with many of the adjacent landowners providing updates to the project throughout the planning process. We have worked with Qualico through many conversations, emails and meetings to coordinate development items required between the parties and entered into a Memorandum of Understanding. Brookfield has also worked with Mattamy and communicated through conversations, meetings and emails and entered into a cost sharing agreement for shared infrastructure required to support the adjacent developments.

We have lease agreements with local farmers and continue to provide them updates on a regular basis of the progress with planning and proposed development timelines. Furthermore, Brookfield has maintained regular contact with adjacent landowners including the Dunn Family, Inez Bishop and Lee Brandon.

Brookfield is in the process of engaging with the Indigenous Communities and working to understand how we can honour culture through our developments. We have formed an internal steering committee at Brookfield with Executive sponsors who are committed to engagement, long term support and building Indigenous relationships. Brookfield has engaged the services of Jessie Fiddler-Kiss on a number of occasions over the past 2 years to provide education to our staff and recently hosted a workshop for Brookfield employees, <https://fiddlerkissconsulting.com/connectfiddlerkissconsulting>.

Several Brookfield employees have been invited to participate in the Elders Knowledge Circle which we believe will support our long-term goals of establishing relationships with the Indigenous Communities. The project includes Treaty 7 elders and is a nonprofit organization. Creation of three experiences

1. Elders Story Circle Events – healing events for survivors of residential schools and family of residential school survivors to share their stories to support healing and knowledge sharing
2. Elder Story Circle Guidebook – a resource for supporting protocol for businesses, government, and Canadian citizens on how to engage with elders and indigenous communities in a way that supports truth and reconciliation
3. Elder Story Book – a published digital multimedia book that will support the sharing of stories and oral knowledge

We have met with Doris Toy-Pries (University of Calgary) and Terry Poucette (City of Calgary) to better understand how we can engage better and were referred to the 94 calls to action in the White Goose Flying Report which we have read and will work to implement through our company by way to an internal strategy and our developments.

We plan to host a land blessing prior to commencing construction and are in the process of determining who we will be working with to provide the ceremony for the Cabana lands. We are committed to supporting the creation of healthy communities and enhancing the emotional health of all residents who choose a Brookfield community.
