- governance model and develop recommendations for Purpose of Review: Assess the existing Council Committee adjustments where necessary








Proposed Council Committee Governance Model ALTERNATIVE 1

CURRENT GOVERNANCE MODEL




ALTERNATIVE ONE: FUTURE STATE GOVERNANCE MODEL





Administration workload and priorities	VS.	Elected Officials workload and priorities
Utilize Strategic Council Meetings for cross-Departmental projects	VS.	Discontinue Strategic Council Meetings
