

## Contextual Information to Support the Growth Application System

A key element of the new approach to evaluating Growth Applications involves the provision of important contextual information on an upfront basis at the beginning of the application process. Beyond fostering greater transparency and consistency, providing information on infrastructure, servicing, and land supply will support more collaborative dialogue between applicants and The City.

The table below provides an indication of the types of information anticipated to be made available to support the new approach for evaluating Growth Applications. This information will evolve through continuous improvement as resources permit.
