Recommendations



That the Community Development Committee recommend that Council:

- 1. Approve the placement of the anticipated additional \$1M of Family and Community Support Services (FCSS) funding from the Government of Alberta for 2023 into the FCSS Stabilization Fund;
- 2. Approve the funding allocation of the anticipated additional \$1.3M of FCSS funding from the Government of Alberta for 2024 across currently funded programs as detailed in Attachment 2; and
- 3. Authorize Administration to access up to \$1.5M from the FCSS Stabilization Fund in 2024 to fund non-profit organizations for emerging social issues and capacity-building initiatives.



Background - FCSS





- Established as a provincial-municipal prevention program
- Governed by FCSS Act, Regulation & Council's Policy
- Guided by FCSS Funding Framework
- Current budget \$40.1 M
- Funding increase from the province



FCSS Funding Increase Allocation



2023 FCSS Funding Increase

- Additional funding of \$1M from the province
- Funding will be received in Q4 2023
- Allocate to FCSS Stabilization Fund

2024 FCSS Funding Increase

- Additional funding of \$1.3M from province
- Allocate across 155 FCSS-funded programs
