## The History, Prior Research, and Spending of Local Access Fees

## **PURPOSE OF BRIEFING**

Affordability is top of mind for many Calgarians, local businesses, and The City. The surge in Alberta electricity prices since 2021 is unprecedented in the history of the Alberta Power Pool, resulting in surging utility costs, a skyrocketing Regulated Rate Option for Electricity, and financial strain. This has also resulted in a higher-than-budgeted Local Access Fee revenue for The City based on the existing Local Access Fee methodology used.

This briefing is in response to direction from the 2023 September 12 Council Meeting, item C2023-0959 (*The Impact of Local Access Fees on Affordability*).
