Council directed exemptions for gas fired electrical generators whose primary purpose is to supply power to the Alberta electrical grid to address “double dipping” concerns.

			practices and several perceived issues, including examination of an alternative approach to levying the fees.
1992 November 26	GP92-83	Canadian Western Natural Gas Franchise Fee	The Gas, Power and Telecommunications Committee discussed the natural gas franchise fee calculation and adopted the recommendation that franchise fees for natural gas do not change.
1991 February 12	GP91-66	Examination of Potential Criteria for Determining Rebates of Gas Franchise Tax	The Gas, Power and Telecommunications Committee discussed the natural gas franchise fee calculation and adopted the recommendation that franchise fees for high load factor natural gas consumers remain at 11.11 per cent.
