Current State

Single price for all eligible recipients below 100% LICO

September 2015 Sliding Scale Proposal

< 50% LICO - Deep Subsidy
0-85% LICO - Substantial Subsidy

50-85% LICO - Substantial Subsidy 85-100% - Modest Subsidy

100-115% LICO - Minimal Subsidy

115-130% LICO – Shallow Subsidy








Sliding Scale – Single Person LICO, Wage and Benefit Thresholds (2015)
