### What did you hear?

A total of 23 letters were received as of the date of this resubmission, with 22 of the residents being in support of the proposal and 1 against.

The concerns from the 1 opposition letter included number of pick-up/drop-off stalls being provided and traffic concerns relative to residences.

### How did input influence decisions?

The intent of this proposal is to convert an existing building into a child care facility with a proposed building addition, and the design was intended to propose minimal site disturbance, including retention of trees and outdoor spaces. Combined with the configuration of the site being a corner parcel with lane connections, limited area was available to provide pick-up/drop-off stalls directly on site.

As street parking is currently allowable along 38 Street SE and 26 Avenue SE, we have proposed pick-up/drop-off stalls along the shoulder of these roadways, as it would provide direct access to the site from both streets, and would facilitate smooth transportation to and from the site.
