RE: Request for wastewater servicing for proposed Renfrew School

Dear Ms. Mackay,

At the March 14, 2023, Regular Meeting of Rocky View Council, Administration was directed to initiate a formal request to the City of Calgary (the City) to allow Renfrew Educational Services (Renfrew) to connect to the City's wastewater service, as per the City's Regional Servicing Policy CP2018-01. Renfrew serves special needs children in the Calgary region since 1974. This letter initiates the utility servicing request process per the City's Regional Servicing Policy.

In December 2022, County Council passed Bylaw C-8269-2022, approving the development of a new Renfrew school in Bearspaw that requires wastewater servicing. A 3-inch (75 mm) wastewater force main is located directly south of the school's property and runs from the Bearspaw School and Lifestyle Centre to the City of Calgary's wastewater collection system (see attached map). While other wastewater servicing options are available to the school, connecting to the existing force main is the preferred solution.

The new Renfrew Educational Services school is proposed to serve a daily population of 293 people with a peak sewage generation of 4.6 L/s considering 230 l/c/d. At this time, it is understood that there is capacity in the force main to service this school. Futher technical details will need to be confirmed in the next steps of the request process.

Connecting the new Renfrew school to existing City wastewater infrastructure allows for the delivery of special education services to residents of both Calgary and Rocky View County in a more cost effective manner. The Calgary Metropolitan Region Board's Growth Plan deliberately did not regulate institutional uses such as schools to avoid limiting the development of essential services for residents.

A Master Services Agreement (MSA) between the City and the County already exists for the Bearspaw School and Lifestyle centre (MSA attached). The MSA specifically governs the flow rates and the type of customer that can be serviced per the agreement. Any changes to the agreement, including a new connection, or a change to the flow rates, requires a formal application from Rocky View County to the City of Calgary to amend the terms of the existing MSA.

Additional considerations to support this connection request include:

## Environmental considerations:

- Use of pipes to convey wastewater materials is environmentally favourable to holding tanks and trucking. However, holding tanks are still required regardless of the solution to manage flows and provide redundancy.
- Reduces potential environmental risk upstream of Calgary and aligns with the City's mandate of Source Water Protection.
