The resulting reports include Parkdale Gathering Place, Parkdale Neighbourhood Activity Centre (ARP), Enriching Parkdale, South Shaganappi Communities Sustainability Plan and a recent community led consultation to prepare for the South Shaganappi Local Area Plan. All input and reports support the redevelopment of Parkdale Crescent NW with a mix of residential and commercial developments.

The Committee met with the applicant and residents to the north of the subject site on 2022 November 8 and with the applicant, residents to the north and west and southeast, business owners and their consultant on 2022 December 5.

We offer the following comments and request The City consider all input when making a decision.

1. Parkdale Community Association supports approval of the application.

This application aligns with the current ARP and community input. However, in reviewing the application, we request The City to consider the site servicing and infrastructure, specifically: below grade utilities such as water and sanitary utilities as well as storm water treatment for the site; impacts on the surrounding laneway traffic arising from building parkade access; impacts on private property access for the properties north of development; and, adequate emergency access to the businesses on Parkdale Crescent Northwest. The applicant indicated a traffic study was done and submitted to The City but did not agree to provide a copy.

2. Concerns raised by adjacent residents and businesses

Most of the concerns raised by the businesses relate to traffic and parking. They noted the existing parking challenges and the potential loss of existing parking with more commercial use. They also identified potential increased delivery challenges with increased traffic in the alley, backups if multiple cars are waiting for the elevator, loading zones blocking the alley,

and access for fire, police and ambulance. There was also a general concern if traffic into the Crescent caused backups on 3rd Ave. NW.

Residents that back onto either the north-south lane to the west or the east-west lane to the north also raised concerns. In addition to laneway traffic issues and personal garage access, they indicated concerns with shadowing of their properties, suggested a reduction in height and requested a shadow study.

Finally adjacent residents noted they were negatively impacted by the recently completed multifamily building on 5th Ave. NW behind this site and are looking for assurances that the contractors operate in a way to minimize the impact on neighbours. The applicant was also asked to consider submitting a Development Permit application concurrently with this LOC application but indicated this would not be done.

Parkdale Crescent and the laneways have had no municipal investment for a number of years and we are optimistic that this project may be a catalyst for further redevelopment and for publicly funded infrastructure improvements; and set MWI has considered an ampoleophase.
