





Red 6, was officially placed into service in 2023.




WEST RUNWAY

\$201 million

The West Runway Rehabilitation project will result in a new runway that will better meet the requirements of diverse aircraft and greater demand for passenger and cargo transportation.

INVESTMENT IN SPRINGBANK

\$3.5 million approved in 2023






TOTAL PASSENGERS



KEY MILESTONES FOR 2023

Decarbonizing airports

Launched a feasibility study for energy efficiency, on-site generation, and retrofit options to reduce carbon footprint.

YYC zero carbon energy district

Engaged stakeholders in designing a district focusing on low-carbon ground transportation for airport users.

Waste reduction initiatives

Implemented a waste reduction strategy, introduced composting, updated waste signage, and enforced a single-use plastics ban in concessions.


Environmental stewardship enhancements

Updated aircraft noise response procedures, advanced stormwater restoration for water quality, and eliminated fluorinated firefighting foam to reduce PFAS contamination.
