

- Memory Anchor project a digital platform to access CAHF inductee and THFM exhibit information.








Building Improvements

- \$1M
 - Building Accessibility Improvements new storefront with automated doors, gateway system, ramp and widened concrete walkways
 - Truss Repairs repairing wood components of the 1941 historic Main Hangar (British Commonwealth Air Training Plan)
 - Tent Hangar Repair
- Thank you to the City of Calgary, PrairiesCan, Travel Alberta, and private donations





Tent Hangar Repair

- Tent Hangar repaired in 2021 and 2023 (twice)
- Susceptible to severe weather damages extreme snow load and windstorms
- Closure resulting in lost revenue
- Building replacement insurance now excludes wind and hail (need permanent structure)
- Priceless aircraft (i.e. Second World War Lancaster Bomber, \$2M, 17 remaining in the world)

2023 Performance Successes



52,000 Visitors

- Record Setting
- 40% increase from 2022 of 37,000
- 2,500 Family Day
- 3,000 National Aviation Day
- 2,000 Remembrance Service
- 1,130 CANOO free admissions, New Canadians



10,500 Students

- Record Setting
- 55% increase from 2022 of 6,502
- 80 Schools (Calgary & Region)
- Alberta's Grade 5 & 6 curriculum
- Canadian Legacy Projects (Veterans) – supporting disadvantaged schools



Earned Revenue \$544,000

- Record Setting 16% increase over 2022 of \$458,000
- Admissions, facility rentals, gift shop, school bookings, special events
- 37% of Budget
- For comparison, City provides Annual Operations Funding (\$428,000 or 30% of our Budget)

- Canadian Legacy Projects (Veterans Programs and Awareness) – supporting disadvantaged schools who have not been able to afford field trips – 37 schools attended
- Aviation Career Exploration
- Immigrant Services Calgary and CANOO Program –

- Elevate Aviation (ACE Program) supporting careers for women in aviation
- Calgary Parks & Recreation Fee Assistance Program (ongoing annually)

- Calgary's RCAF Mess Dinner (200 people)

- Restoration continues with:
 - CF-100 Canuck (City Owned Asset)
 - Second World War Mosquito Bomber (City Owned Asset)
- Calgary stories that add to and enhance our amazing collection

New Facility Plan

- \$50M \$60M Feasibility Study high level
- \$14.5M City of Calgary (approved)
- \$5.5M Calgary Airport Authority (In-kind land-use agreement)
- \$15M Capital Campaign (philanthropy)
- \$5M \$10M Federal (program specific)
- *\$14.5M Government of Alberta (requesting contribution to match City of Calgary contribution and philanthropy

Immediate need of \$2M for Detailed Design Work to bring project shovel ready.
