APPENDIX A: ABOUT THE CALGARY SPORT TOURISM AUTHORITY

The Calgary Sport Tourism Authority (CSTA) was established in 2005 by The City of Calgary and is a collaboration of citizens and leaders from the private sector. Calgary Economic Development, Tourism Calgary, Calgary Sport & Entertainment, Canadian Sport Institute, WinSport, and The City of Calgary. The CSTA framework is a platform of research and due diligence, pursuing events that help to advance social, cultural and economic objectives, while enhancing Calgary's brand and improving quality of life for its residents.

In 2014, the CSTA's activity resulted in Calgary being named as an Ultimate Sports City (Best Small City category) and 5th overall globally by SportBusiness International. In early 2016, Calgary was again shortlisted into the competition as one of the top 30 sport cities in the world and received a 6th place ranking globally. The CSTA's expertise and responsibility includes a broad range of endeavors, from investing in amateur competitions to executing the feasibility and bid programs to host some of the largest events in the world, including major international multi-sport games. The CSTA's work was recognized as a model of best practice as the 2014 Sport Tourism Organization of the Year (Canadian Sport Tourism Alliance).
