Notes:

- The values of the data collected might vary depending on circumstances such as construction, weather, change in local economy, or unforeseen events.
- Satisfaction survey and interviews will include pedestrians, cyclists, motorists, Calgary Transit, emergency services, residents, business owners, and employees.
- Collision data will include number of collisions and rate of pedestrian, cyclist, and auto collisions, severity (property damage only, injury, fatality), location, and type.
 - The collisions database may not include all collisions of the prior year, as any court proceedings related to collisions must be finished before collisions can be added to the database.
 - Collision data can vary significantly from year to year. That's why collision data is usually analyzed over a longer time span, such as three years or five years.
 - For reference purposes, the number of collisions on the 7 St SW cycle track reduced by 4 crashes or 14% in the year after opening, from 28 per year on average for the three years prior to opening to 24 in the year after opening.
 - For reference purposes, the collision rate or number of collisions per 100,000 population in Calgary is going down every year, as described in the Safer Mobility Plan.
- Economic vitality targets apply to 2/3 of merchants. **Multiple factors influence economic vitality and some are beyond the control of the municipal government. The current economic downturn and jobs lost in Centre City might impact economic performance measures.**

Removed: Performance Measure 8 (Gender) for '6 months 2015 01' and '6 months 2016 01'. Manual and video camera data collection is unable to accurately determine gender in the winter.
