
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

### Background


- Green Line delivery strategy, developed in 2012-2014, is predicated on the lack of sufficient funding for LRT
- The announcement of the Public Transit Fund by the Government of Canada opens the door to review that strategy




## Government of Canada's **Public Transit Fund**


- Announced as part of Economic Action Plan 2015 in May
- Further details released by Prime Minister Harper or 2015
  - Permanent support for large-scale public transit projects to address traffic congestion, reduce travel time for goods and people, and support economic growth in Canada's largest cities
  - To be eligible, projects must have a minimum of \$1 billion in total estimated eligible costs
  - Frees up funds under the Building Canada Plan and P3
    Canada Fund that might have been used up by large-scale transit projects
    Fund will support up to 1/3 of eligible project costs
    Administered by PPP Canada Inc. on behalf of the Government of Canada
    \$750 million in 2017 and 2018, and \$1 billion per year thereafter



Announced in 2014	Announced in 2015
10-year fund, \$14 Billion across Canada	Ongoing future fund, 30+ years, \$1 Billion <u>per year</u> across Canada;
Green Line Transitway proposed – fits with stacking limits and Investing In Mobility funding envelopes (10-year fund → 10-year project)	Green Line Transitway <u>or</u> LRT proposed – <b>fit with 30 year RouteAhead timeline for LRT</b> on the Green Line (30+ year fund → LRT project)
Application made to Federal Government in 2014 along with two other projects (Goods Movement and Disaster Resiliency)	Staging of LRT to be reviewed with Council in December (or earlier depending on submission deadlines) before formal application is made.



- Draft table of contents is included in Attachment 3 of the report
