

Number of visitors who exclusively visited the museum. :	24,750	25,088	 Change in visitors who exclusively visited the museum +1% Stability in current economic conditions is a positive sign. 	 In a difficult year, there was a minor increase in visitation. All of the special event visitors, private and public, have access to the museum. Fort Calgary continues to be part of the Tourism Infrastructure.
