Planning and Development Services Briefing to Intergovernmental Affairs Committee 2024 October 09

City of Chestermere – City of Calgary Intermunicipal Committee – 2024 September Meeting Update

PURPOSE OF BRIEFING

The purpose of this briefing is to update the Intergovernmental Affairs Committee on the work of the City of Chestermere – City of Calgary Intermunicipal Committee meeting held on 2024 September 20.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

Councillor Gian-Carlo Carra and Councillor Andre Chabot represented The City of Calgary at the meeting. Mayor Shannon Dean and Councillor Rob Wawrynowski represented the City of Chestermere. This was the first Intermunicipal Committee (Committee) meeting with the newly elected City of Chestermere members. The last Committee meeting was held 2023 October.

The Committee received a presentation with a status update on five current projects being worked on collaboratively among the two municipalities. Those projects were: (1) implementation of the 17 Avenue – Chestermere Boulevard multi-modal corridor; (2) the Range Road 284 Functional Study; (3) the Joint Planning Area 2 Context Study; (4) the Tri-Party Recreation Study and (5) the Canada Public Transit Fund Metro-Region Agreement application.

The Committee shared its respective municipalities' commitments to participating in the Canada Public Transit Funding program and to exploring funding opportunities to advance the development of 17 Avenue – Chestermere Boulevard multi-modal corridor. Implementation of the multi-modal corridor vision was identified as important to both municipalities.

Advancing opportunities for recreation was identified as priority work by Chestermere members. The Committee agreed to hold a follow-up meeting in the immediate future to discuss collaboration on regional recreation initiatives including an update on the Tri-Party Recreation Study that includes Rocky View County.
