What's more at the last meeting the City spokesperson admitted to making up numbers as well as comparing a facility with 'wave pools' to Inglewood. This lack of transparency and obsfucation certainly leaves me wondering where the truth really lies. With the push for multiple developments in Inglewood and close by communities I feel it's actually irresponsible to close this pool. The survey recently sent out regarding the cities plan to look at pools etc for Calgarys future covered a list of people but signifi- cantly ignored seniors and those with disabilities. The closure of Inglewood certainly confirms the Cities focus is not on helping All Residents of Calgary. The closure of Inglewood and other facilities for repairs will already displace thousands of swimmers, and limit access to essential fitness facilities. With fewer options avail- able, demand will lead to overcrowding and longer wait times. Families, seniors, com- petitive swimmers, and those relying on aquatic therapy will be disproportionately affected. We keep being told to use the MNP which advertises it is focussed on its membership. This will severely limit access for non members. Yet the city is investing millions. Not counting the fact the MNP is unsuitable for those with mobility, financial, visual, and auditory issues (it is very

We, as a family of 4, had membership and tried using MNP pools before, being kicked out as all aquatic facilities are always booked for lessons except for public holidays. In fact, I went to the extent of checking all public pools in the City of Calgary, not including leisure centers, and there is NOT a single public pool with open public swim after 4 pm on a business day. All public swim is before 4 pm when children are at school and adults are at work. If the city needs more "usage" for the public pools, I do encourage the city opening pools for public usage, including children on Fri, Sat and Sunday evenings when most pools are closed and no lessons are in session. The swimming lessons are impossible to get into; there is far more demand for lessons than supply of pool facilities. Booking a lesson at 5 in the morning is not a reasonable means of lesson accessibility. Leisure centers are not a comparable alternative to community pools as they are \$18 vs \$8 entrance fee, and too busy to accommodate general public, children and people with reduced mobility. I encourage the City Council to try to go swimming to MNP Center in the evening and try to succeed. Understandably, the maintenance costs are high and public facilities are not profit cen- ters; however, this is what population pays taxes for. Certainly, Inglewood land would bring more value in property taxes as commercial or residential development but that only increases the population while decreasing the quality of life for the existing com- munity residents. Maybe it is better to follow the example of Switzerland where land is protected for public use and vineyards and not available for further residential develop- ment thus maintaining the highest levels of living in the world. 

Re: Planned Closure of Inglewood Pool

Dear Council,

Please accept this letter as my strong support to reconsider the planned closure of Inglewood Pool. I have a long history in sports and in particular aquatic sports, and will draw on those in this letter. I have use point form where possible to streamline.

While I would love the pool to stay open for the longer term, I understand the constraints that may make that infeasible. That does not mean it should close imminently, and I hope Council can agree to keep the pool open, without major upgrades and at reasonable cost, at least until MNP expansion is complete and that facility is operating at full capacity.

Firstly, I am currently the co-founder of Calgary Nomads Masters Swimming, a masters (adults only) swim group. This is a small business that currently operates out of the Inglewood Pool – two nights per week. Closure of the pool likely means the end of the club.

- We have ~ 40 registered members; most are recreational/fitness, a few of us compete.
- We use Inglewood because our prior pool, the Eau Claire YMCA, shut down.
- Closure of Inglewood literally puts us out of a home, and likely puts us out of business entirely:
  - No other reasonable options available: MNP offered 5:15 am as only weekday time available;
  - Other City pools either full or not willing to expand hours/staffing to accommodate anything close to our current 6:30-7:30 pm timeslot.
  - Most of our members are central Calgary commuting to Seton or Rocky View is not feasible

While the City is providing almost \$60 million to MNP for expansion (though the expansion pool is smaller than Inglewood (4 lanes to our current 6 lanes), the City is apparently unwilling to find \$750,000 to keep Inglewood open for another year (or slightly more than \$1 million for two) – even though MNP expansion will not be complete until 2027 – AND EVEN MORE PROBLEMATIC – even though MNP will have to close one of its pools during renovations placing much greater pressure on pool space around the City.

The City (and others) have been closing pools and athletic facilities in the inner city (YMCA, YWCA, Beltline, etc...) – and they are not being replaced.... While urban densification makes sense – one of the premises of that densification is the ready availability of amenities and services. If one lives in the inner city but must still commute out of the core for services, not only are we impacting the draw of inner city living, but we are also contributing to increased traffic, increased costs and loss of tie and efficiency.

Swimming is also the only sport that can save your life. As a city founded at juncture of two rivers, we ought to be leaders in water safety at a young age. Approximately 500 people drown every year in Canada – and this risk is even greater for immigrants to Canada. Likely this reflects both the lack of swimming lessons in their country of origin and the relative inaccessibility (or even cost) of swimming pools and swimming lessons. Basic proficiency in the water – and even simply a comfort level that may lessen panic – can save lives.

I also have a long involvement in high performance sport, and currently sit on the boards of the Canadian Olympic Committee and the Canadian Sport Institute Alberta. While high performance sport is largely funded at the national level – these high-performance athletes don't get to that level without starting somewhere. They start in municipal facilities, whether as rink rats, minnows, etc.... Sporting facilities – at least for entry level athletes – are by and far municipal jurisdiction. The vast majority of kids who join organized sport do not get to the national team, or high-performance level. Instead, they develop and hone essential skills (teamwork, dedication, perseverance, to name a few) while also increasing their health, and hopefully developing a life-long fitness habit. Organized sport can save lives and create good citizens. Fewer places to start a sport will lead to fewer athletes.

Finally, and by no means least, facilities like pools can operate as community hubs. They are places people can meet others in the neighbourhood, places to learn new skill, and places to become Calgarian. Whether you have moved to Calgary from another city, province, country or continent, places like Inglewood pool give you an opportunity to become enmeshed in our great city.

Regardless of the hat I wear – I urge you to reconsider the closure and grant Inglewood pool a temporary reprieve. At the very least, please keep the pool open until some of the loss ca be accommodated at MNP, which while not a perfect solution in any way, is better than a simple closure without any replacement.

I thank you in advance for considering this plea – and hope that I can speak to Council on November 26.

# RE: Motion to Reconsider Early Closure of the Inglewood Pool

I respectfully ask that Council reconsider the October 8, 2024, motion to close the Inglewood Pool early. The reasons are:

- 1. Operating funds had already been approved as part of the five-year budget.
- 2. Attendance (usage) of the pool has been negatively impacted since COVID and in particular by a significant reduction in the number of operating hours the pool is open. This results in skewed attendance figures.
- It is my understanding that several pools will be shut down for maintenance over the coming 12-24 months. Keeping the Inglewood Pool open during that time will provide a resource for those patrons from the closed locations to use.
- As stated by the Director of Recreation and Social Programs at the October 8, 2024, Council meeting, "There's <u>no safety risk to customers or staff</u>, but there is potential for a full electrical systems failure, ...".
- 5. With the closure of the Beltline pool and the downtown YMCA, inner city residents do not have an easily accessible swim option. **NOTE:** The YMCA has re-opened as a private facility and membership fees are outside of the reach of most residents. The MNP facility may offer some level of subsidy, but many users of the Inglewood Facility would not qualify. In addition, transportation from Inglewood to MNP would create a new barrier to access for many local residents.

Pending a catastrophic mechanical/electrical failure, the pool should continue to funded and operate until late 2026, when MNP renovations are expected to be completed.

In a year when there are already several anticipated pool closures for renovations, it will be even more difficult to register children for swim lessons. The pool has in the past served also as a valuable community resource with an Afterschool program (which my daughter attended) and could still be developed into something amazing, particularly given the number of low-income folks in the 'hood (e.g., YWCA housing, youth housing program, Alice Bissett CMHA subsidized housing). I believe even the exisiting pool schedule with limited accessibility is only serving to doom it and it is hard not to be a cynical about why these decision were made (e.g., public swim time 3-4pm when school ends at at 3:20pm! how silly! still only 1 hour public swim times on school days off over fall break. and no apparent scheduling between 4-6pm, so why now let the surrounding neighbourhood pay to use it?). The city argues that the pool is not "profitable" but is this really the purpose of a community resource, to be profitable? The same could be said about road maintenance, environmental movements, and the like! The pool is a resource, and the investment put in by the city should be in peoples' quality of life, not eventual profit. There is actually a lot to be said about providing children/at-risk youth/ adults a place to be healthy at, with gains in connection and mental health, and even gang diversion, so perhaps the gains are just less evident than immediate dollars. Finally, I have been to MNP and it is NOT a substitute for a community pool expensive, busy, and difficult to get to (the opposite of what one wants/needs for a walkable neighbourhood). MNP is ok for the occasional "treat" outing, but for day-to-day needs for children and neighbourhood residents, the Inglewood pool will be sorely missed if the city allows this closure to happen.

Dear Mayor Gondek and council,

I am writing to urge you to reconsider the closure of the Inglewood Aquatic Centre and to keep it open until at least the end of 2026, when the MNP Community & Sport Centre's new expansion is completed. It is crucial to recognize that the City has not fulfilled its commitments to promote, market, perform regular maintenance, and extend the pool's hours—factors that have contributed to the inaccurate portrayal of underuse.

The Inglewood Aquatic Centre holds untapped potential as a vibrant community hub. With strategic promotion, it could become a convenient stop for commuters seeking lap swimming before and after work, while also serving seniors and fitness enthusiasts. On November 13, I witnessed 30 people attending a deep water aerobics class at the Inglewood pool, underscoring the pool's value to the community. Not to mention users that come from other communities, due to over crowding of other city pools.

The City frequently cites lifeguard shortages as a challenge. However, the Inglewood Aquatic Centre could serve as an ideal training ground for future lifeguards, fostering local talent and addressing this issue. Unfortunately, the City's decisions have undermined the pool's growth—reducing its hours and claiming underutilization. For instance, in the summer of 2023, lifeguards were reassigned from Inglewood to Village Square Leisure Centre, leaving Inglewood with limited hours on just Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Such decisions fail to encourage regular use and instead contribute to declining attendance, rather than promoting the pool as promised.

It is also unfair to compare the Inglewood Aquatic Centre's revenue and usage statistics to those of facilities like Village Square Leisure Centre—a large complex with vastly different amenities. Similarly, comparisons to Renfrew Pool overlook significant differences in operating hours and facilities. The Renfrew Pool operates from 6:00 am to 10:00 pm and includes a hot tub and steam room, whereas Inglewood's restricted hours (opening at 11:00 am and closing as early as 7:30 pm on weekdays and 3:30 pm on weekends) limit accessibility and usage. The main reason cited for the Inglewood pool's closure is \$600,000 in mechanical repairs. Yet, despite repeated requests, no detailed quote has been provided. We appreciate Councillors Sharp and Chabot's confirmation with city administration, that a temporary repair would cost \$350,000. It would be more fiscally responsible to reintegrate the Inglewood Aquatic Centre into the operating budget than to spend a minimum of \$2 million on demolition, only to leave an empty parking lot.

Additionally, the MNP Community & Sport Centre plans to close one of its pools during its construction. Renfrew, Glenmore, and Southland pools are also expected to close for mechanical repairs—where will people swim? Keeping the Inglewood Aquatic Centre open until the MNP expansion is completed is the only sensible option. Inglewood's population density is increasing more rapidly than any other community in the city, highlighting the need for more local pools. Centralized recreational centres cannot meet the unique needs of every community. Years ago, parents successfully fought to keep Inglewood's elementary school open, proving that when invested in, these facilities thrive. Today, with even more families in Inglewood and surrounding neighbourhoods, closing the pool is shortsighted.

At the October 8 council meeting, it was suggested that low-income earners could apply for a fair entry program to use MNP. However, how can a new immigrant mother with three children staying at the Sheriff King shelter, who doesn't speak English fluently, navigate this process? What about families that do not qualify but cannot afford the higher entrance fees at MNP? Our communities Ward 9 councillor suggested "that I buy an electric scooter to travel to MNP," I ask you, how is a senior awaiting hip surgery or a single mother of three supposed to manage this 34 minute trek in -30°C weather? These barriers will leave many without options.

Flat-water community pools provide essential services. Swimming is a critical life skill, especially in a neighbourhood so close to the river. Closing the Inglewood Aquatic Centre sends a message that increased taxes and higher density come at the expense of public services. Our campaign to save the pool has included successful rallies, a well-attended event at the

Dear Calgary Council Members,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed closure of our local pool in Inglewood/Ramsay. I believe closing this facility would be shortsighted, particularly given several critical factors that deserve your consideration.

First, the alternative facility at MNP has not yet completed their promised expansion that was meant to precede our pool's closure. Even when operational, MNP frequently restricts access to members during peak times and charges significantly higher fees, making it an inadequate replacement for our community pool. This creates a significant gap in accessible aquatic services for our residents.

The financial aspect also requires careful examination. The projected costs to demolish the pool actually exceed the maintenance costs - making closure a more expensive option that eliminates a valuable community asset. This decision becomes even more concerning when considering the increasing population density in Inglewood and Ramsay. The pool's current usage statistics don't reflect its true potential or community value. My name is Shane Stamp, and I am a resident of Inglewood. I am writing to you as a concerned husband, deeply troubled by the potential closure of our community swimming pool. My wife, suffers from degenerating C6 and C7 discs in her back, a condition that causes her severe pain and limits her mobility. For her, swimming is not a luxury—it is a critical part of her health management, and I fear that losing access to this facility will have devastating consequences for her well-being.

Over the past several years, my wife has found significant relief and physical improvement through swimming. The buoyancy of the water allows her to exercise without the harsh impact on her joints and spine that would result from other forms of exercise. This low-impact environment is crucial for her as she works to manage her chronic pain and maintain the strength needed to cope with her condition. Her doctors have recommended regular swimming as one of the few activities that can help her preserve mobility and delay further deterioration of her discs.

Unfortunately, her condition is degenerative, meaning that as time passes, it will only get worse without proper care. Without access to the pool, I fear my wife's physical health will deteriorate more quickly, leading to increased pain, reduced mobility, and a greater reliance on medications and treatments. We would like the hours be as in Renfrew. The benefits to my wife and others in our community are immeasurable. Without this facility, the long-term health costs for our area will only rise, as people will face worsening health conditions and increased dependence on medical interventions.

I urge you to keep this vital resource open for the sake of my wife's health and the health of many others in our community. Thank you for your time and attention to this deeply personal matter.

Both my daughters, now ages 14 and 16, took their swim lessons at the pool and we enjoyed many family swims there on weekends when they were younger. It is the perfect sized pool for families to swim in and meet up with other families and friends in the community.

As my girls grew older, they were able to go to the pool to swim on their own. And I think that is one of the most valuable parts of a community swimming pool.

A local pool gives children independence. It also fosters activity in a safe space. It was the first place my girls walked to and from on their own (other than a park!). They could spend weekend afternoons meeting up with friends and playing in the pool. As a parent you know they are both safe and being active in your community.

The local pool is also inexpensive compared to other activities in our city. I want other families and children in Inglewood and surrounding areas to have that opportunity.

The experience for children and families is not the same at a big recreation centre like MNP. It is not walkable, nor is it as affordable. It does not have the same sense of security and community.

I feel that places like pools and libraries are some of most important services that our city provides. Tax money well spent.

Please keep the Inglewood pool open.

### **RE: Reconsideration Proposed Inglewood Pool Closure**

Dear Mayor Gondek and Members of City Council

Please accept this appeal in the spirit in which it is intended. It is consistent with The City's expressed objectives of building strong, socially sustainable, walkable, and age-friendly and inclusive communities. The City's plans to densify communities especially in established neighbourhoods give even more weight to this position.

The above makes maintaining existing infrastructure such as educational, and recreational facilities, a prudent choice. The Inglewood Pool fits both those categories including being a community social hub, especially when community pool access was more dependable. It is my understanding (from pool users) that in recent times Inglewood Pool hours have not been conducive to regular and dependable use; it is quite possible that the stated "low use" of the pool is a direct result of a slow and measured decrease in operational schedules. Many of you and City Administration know, that community life cycle and associated demographic changes are predictable contributors to ebb and flow of infrastructure usage. It would be short sighted to base community infrastructure plans on community lifecycle. Regardless, Inglewood continues to undergo significant redevelopment since the 90's, with an increase in its housing base and increase in young families. Effective planning for periods of lower use would be better mitigated with interim uses and programming, not destruction of existing infrastructure.

The Inglewood Pool is also an asset to neighbouring communities including Ramsay. Both community's demographics include a significant number of seniors on low income as well as families living in subsidized housing. Both Inglewood and Ramsay Schools have a high proportion of modest to low income families including the Piitoayis Family School, a CBE First Nations School. A local swimming pool offers opportunities for physical education programming for students, summer camps, vital low impact exercise classes for seniors, and lane swimming. All of these were provided at the Inglewood Pool. In addition the Pool provided training space for swim clubs. In short the Inglewood Pool serves many purposes, when its hours are not shortened.

The Inglewood Pool is one of the many community resources gifted to community residents local noteworthy families, in this case the Cross Family. Others include the Inglewood Lawn Bowling Club, and the Baseball Diamonds. The community invested time and its Neighbourhood Improvement dollars on these. It would be a pity for Inglewood to lose the pool as it did its Baseball Diamonds.

City Administration has now revealed that the cost of repairs to the pool range from \$125,000 to \$150,000. It seems a relatively small investment versus demolition of vital community infrastructure. It is hard to believe that this investment in Inglewood and neighbouring communities is not worthwhile. If The City deems this community investment too high, it is plausible that these funds could be raised in partnership between the development industry and investors, who are highly motivated to develop in the area.

In closing, I implore Council Members to support reconsideration of the Inglewood Pool Closure and champion your expressed values and objectives for strong, sustainable, age-friendly, healthy communities. This community itself was long-sighted in championing inclusion and protection of its more fragile and less fortunate members, in the face of gentrification. This also prevented Inglewood's phase out as a residential community and its turnover to industrial lands; which in fact still existed in The City's plans in the early 90's. The significant community engagement on the pool demonstrates Inglewood's commitment to working with The City to preserve its social fabric, and ensure a truly inclusive community. Please help us to do so; together we can make a difference.

Dear Council

I am writing to you to express my support of council's decision to reconsider the impending closure of the Inglewood aquatic centre.

I am a member of the Calgary Nomads masters swim team that swims out of the Inglewood aquatic centre twice a week. We relocated to the Inglewood pool 3 years ago following the closure of the YMCA pool in Eau Claire. I have been swimming with this team now for almost 8 years. Our team will likely disband if Inglewood aquatic centre closes. Like many of the other user groups of this facility the communities that are built will be broken up as a result of the closure. We were fortunate to find the Inglewood pool after the Eau Claire pool closed but we're now sadly faced with same fate that we did a number of years ago.

Whilst I acknowledge swimming pools are expensive facilities to run what's always impressed me is people of all ages, abilities, disabilities can use them at ease. In Q2 of 2023 I was able to take my 8 week old son to a swimming pool whilst around the same time I witnessed a 98 year old woman swim in the Canadian Masters championship here in Calgary. Swimming facilities are truely unique in how accessible they are to everyone in the community. The health, rehabilitation from injuries, wellness benefits are unmatched by any other facility the city offers.

It's extremely disappointing that inner city facilities appear to keep closing whilst there's such an emphasis on densification. I urge council to align its 2024 priorities whilst making these decisions to close such facilities and not the previous priorities that led council to initiate the closure of the pool.

I urge you to vote in favour of keeping the pool open but at the very least until the MNP renovations are complete. I also urge you to explore the possibility of incorporating the pool into the development that is proposed there. Maybe this could be a template for aging city facilities to incorporate new uses whilst acknowledging past use.

### **Re: Planned Closure of Inglewood Aquatic Center**

Dear Council Members,

I am writing to express my strong support for the continued operation of the Inglewood Aquatic Center. As a member of the Nomads Swim Club, I train at the Inglewood pool twice a week, and I have greatly benefited from my ability to access to the pool - not only for my physical health but also for the sense of community it provides. The Nomads Swim Club would likely not be able to continue if the Inglewood pool is closed, as there is insufficient pool space available at other central Calgary locations.

As someone who grew up in competitive swimming, I understand the value of aquatics to the community. Swimming is an activity enjoyed by many Calgarians, whether through lessons, recreational swims, or for fitness. The Inglewood pool serves a broad range of users and is a vital resource in our city.

Outside of my personal connection to the pool, I believe the loss of a local facility like this would be really unfortunate. Central to good urban development are the concepts of walkability and livability—the ease with which residents can access essential services and amenities. I choose to live in central Calgary to be near these conveniences, and the Inglewood Aquatic Center plays a key role in my quality of life, I know it is the same for many others. In response to the concerns of Inglewood pool users, MNP has been suggested as a suitable alternative for pool access. Unfortunately, MNP is just not a comparable option for centrally located residents who currently rely on Inglewood.

For example, my commute to Inglewood is just 10 minutes by car or 20 minutes by bike. In contrast, traveling to MNP would take double the time by car (requiring a commute through downtown) and is outside a reasonable biking distance. Additionally, MNP's dropin rate is \$18, more than twice the \$8.70 rate at Inglewood. Evening lane swim times at MNP are also severely limited, with only 2-4 lanes available between 4:00 PM and 10:00 PM on weekdays—far from sufficient to accommodate the needs of central Calgary swimmers.

While I understand that the Inglewood pool may not be able to remain open indefinitely, I urge you to consider the immense value it provides to the community. It offers affordable, centrally located access to aquatic facilities, making it an essential resource for many Calgarians.

Closing the Inglewood Pool on Dec 22 seems short-sighted when one considers the planned 2025 maintenance closures of Renfrew, Glenmore, Southland, and MNP Pools. These closures will displace thou- sands of swimmers and limit access to essential fitness facilities. With fewer options like Inglewood being available, demands on remaining pools will, rise leading to over- crowding and longer wait times. For that reason alone, Inglewood Pool should at the very least be funded until ALL MNP construction and the pool maintenance has been completed and all pools are fully operational. Dear Madam Worship, Members of Council

I am writing to express my strong concern regarding the recent decision to close the community swimming pool. While I understand that difficult financial and operational decisions sometimes need to be made, I firmly believe that the decision to close the pool has been rushed and lacks the necessary data, proper community consultation, and long-term planning. These oversights not only undermine the decision's legitimacy but also risk overlooking the significant negative impact on our community's health, particularly for those who rely on the pool for exercise rather than leisure.

First and foremost, it appears the decision to close the pool was made without presenting comprehensive data to the public about its usage, financial viability, and the long-term consequences of closure. A decision of this magnitude requires clear, transparent information, such as detailed user statistics, maintenance and operational costs, and analysis of the social, health, and economic impacts of the closure. Without this data, the public cannot fully understand the rationale behind the decision, nor can we offer informed feedback. More importantly, it raises serious concerns about whether this decision has been based on short-term cost-saving measures rather than a well-considered, long-term strategy for the community's well-being. Furthermore, it seems that the voices of those who rely on the pool for vital health and fitness purposes have not been sufficiently taken into account.

The pool serves as a crucial resource for seniors, people with disabilities, individuals recovering from injury, and those with

chronic conditions who need low-impact exercise. Swimming and water-based exercises are often recommended by healthcare professionals as the most effective form of physical activity for people with conditions such as arthritis, fibromyalgia, and degenerative spinal issues, because water provides support to the body and reduces strain on joints. The closure of this pool would significantly disrupt the ability of these individuals to maintain their health, independence, and quality of life.

It is also important to note that the type of pool we have is essential for rehabilitation and exercise. Many people rely on flat-water pools specifically designed for low-impact, therapeutic exercise—this is not the same as the recreational or leisure swimming found in other types of facilities. For those of us with medical needs, the pool's calm, steady water is an environment where we can safely engage in structured exercise routines that are impossible to replicate in a leisure pool or a non-specialized facility. The closure of this flat-water pool will take away a critical space for safe and effective exercise, which can lead to long-term health issues, higher healthcare costs, and greater dependency on medical treatments.

Additionally, the failure to consult with these user groups—those who depend on the pool for health and rehabilitation—is a significant oversight. The lack of community engagement in the decision-making process has left many individuals in the dark about why such an important service is being taken away. For many, this pool is not just a luxury, it is a lifeline to maintaining their mobility, independence, and overall health. The decision to close it without sufficient community input, particularly from those most affected, is deeply troubling.

Finally, I believe the Council has not fully explored alternative solutions. There are many potential ways to reduce costs or improve efficiency without closing the facility entirely. These could include

adjusting hours, seeking community partnerships, or exploring other revenue-generating opportunities. Closing the pool outright, without exhausting all other options, feels premature and hasty. The consequences for public health—particularly for vulnerable groups—must be given equal weight in this decision-making process. I urge the Council to pause and reconsider this decision. There is no question that we must look for ways to balance financial responsibility with the needs of our community, but it is essential that we make these decisions with careful thought, proper data, and full community consultation. I implore you to listen to the voices of those who rely on this pool for their physical health and quality of life and to explore every possible alternative to closure before making a final decision.

Thank you for your time and attention. I hope the Council will reconsider and take the necessary steps to ensure this valuable resource remains available to those who need it most.

For many in the community, Inglewood Pool is the only accessible, low-impact option for exercise. Knowing now the City estimate to repair is \$125K , and estimate to demolish \$2 mil- ion , the economic case is clear.



#### **Re: Closure of the Inglewood Pool**

Dear Council,

I am writing to you today as a recently retire Olympian, Canadian Olympic Committee Athletes' Commission member and an Inglewood Pool community member with the Calgary Nomads Masters Swimming Club. From these various perspectives, as I will highlight below, I strongly urge the council to reconsider the closure of the Inglewood Aquatic Centre.

#### **Retired Olympian**

I retired a 26-year long career in competitive swimming this past January 2024, during which I represented Canada on the world stage at many events including the inaugural Youth Olympics in 2010, the Olympic Games in 2016 and most recently the Pan American Games in 2023 as champion of the 100m breaststroke and 4x100m medley relay. All this to say that the roots of my swimming success began in Lethbridge, Alberta. Being from a smaller community and thus participating in grass-root swimming clubs, I cannot express enough the importance of these communities - similar to the Inglewood pool community. These facilities go beyond being just pools, they are the lifeblood of so many incredible possibilities. Of course, not everyone goes on to become an Olympian, but I have seen first-hand innumerable examples of the positive impact local pools have on the diverse clientele that attend, which often goes unnoticed. The lessons that learned at facilities like the Inglewood pool give rise to skills that serve people for the rest of their lives. Not only do pools provide water safety proficiencies, the skills learned by being involved in the local clubs and recreational activities run out of these facilities aid in creating happy, healthy and contributing citizens of the city. Leadership, cooperation, communication, dedication and perseverance are just a small few of the qualities one picks up from participating in pool activities, whether they are organized programs or not. By eliminating access to an intregal part of the Inglewood community at the intended date of December 22nd, the city would be depriving this area the immeasurable benefits gained by groups and individuals that are patrons of the aquatic centre.

#### **Canadian Olympic Committee Athletes' Commission**

As a member of the Canadian Olympic Committee Athletes' Commission (COC-AC) we look at and discuss sporting matters on a national and international scale. Matters ranging from athletes rights to safe sport to sporting policies and more. We have currently been discussing and researching the structure of sport in Canada and how it compares to other countries. Unfortunately, while Canada does see great sporting success at the high performance level, we see sport and recreation struggling at the city and provincial level. A contributing factor to this (amongst others) is accessibility. This includes cost and facility availability in that today the cost of participating in exercise and the barriers in conventicle to access facilities is a major issue in Canada when assessed beside comparable countries. I understand that it may not be feasible to keep the Inglewood pool running for the long-term, but closing it alongside the anticipated closure of MNP would be at a huge determent to community engagement in exercise and in turn overall health. Additionally, the entry cost for a family to MNP (\$33) compared to the Inglewood pool (\$17.75) let alone the additional cost one may have to incur to travel to MNP or another pool less convenience should be enough to make one reconsider the hardship closing the pool will have on families and individuals (MNP single adult drop-in \$18/Inglewood pool single adult drop-in \$8.70). Personally, my belief is the relatively small amount (in the grand scheme of a city budget) of funds needed to keep the Inglewood pool open long-term should be provided, but realistically I understand there may be barriers to this. At the very least, however, the Inglewood pool should remain open while the MNP pool undergoes its construction, as families and other aquatic enthusiasts will have nowhere to go – negatively impacting many citizens of Calgary.

#### Inglewood Pool community member with the Calgary Nomads Masters Swimming Club

As indicated earlier in my letter, I recently retired from competitive swimming. For mental health reasons, it took me a long time to be able to come back to a pool. Having competed at the University of Calgary Aquatic Centre, MNP and the Brookfield Residential YMCA at Seaton, I knew attending these pools were not an option for my continued wellness. I found the Calgary Nomads Masters Swimming Club through word-of-mouth and the club is just the right fit for a retired competitive athlete. One of the major contributing factors to my continued training with the Club is the Inglewood pool. Needless to say, I have swum in countless pools in Calgary, Canada and the world. Unlike most pools, you can tell that the Inglewood pool and the community it fosters is special and I wouldn't be able to put it to justice with words - you would have to see for yourself! The welcoming kindness that you are met with, not only from club members, but from lifeguards and all patrons is something that is hard to find and even harder to create. The positive mental-health impact that this pool has had on me, and I have no doubt many others, is something I will always be grateful for. Sometimes you don't need a massive, worldclass complex. Sometimes what you need is a grassroots, cozy, holistic-centred facility and at the Inglewood pool patrons are always met with just that. Facilities are not a one-size-fits-all and having smaller community pools like Inglewood's catered to a diverse range of people and populations. I know I wouldn't be swimming today if it were not for this pool and I am sure that I can say same for countless other individuals.

Therefore, I close by restating that I strongly support the council in to reconsider the closing of the Inglewood pool. If not to find a solution in keeping the pool open indefinitely – at least to extend its closure date to after the MNP renovations are complete.

The pool is an important piece of our community and the estimated costs of its repair are modest when weighed against the benefits the pool provides. Families, seniors and youth can walk or cycle a short distance to this indoor recreation space. I understand that the estimated cost of repairs needed for the pool are just \$600,000, and that the land on which the pool is located will pass to the owner of the surrounding lands if the pool is closed. Choosing to make this modest investment in a central neighbourhood of a growing city seems like a no-brainer. By closing the pool, Council would be giving away valuable land rights to the detriment of Calgarians. Housing density is visibly increasing in Inglewood with the addition of multiple condo developments and infills over the past few years and more in the works. Inglewood has also recently welcomed the YWCA crisis shelter, transitional housing and affordable housing developments, which have brought more kids, youth and single-parent families into our community. As the community grows, walkable public spaces like the Inglewood pool become even more important. As the City approves housing development projects in our neighbourhood, it should be increasing its investment in existing public infrastructure, and finding innovative ways to make them more useful - not pulling the plug. If there is concern that the pool is under-used, we should think about how to get more people in the door. Options might include adding a library space or fitness room. We love our community A multi-plex recreation centre across town cannot replace what the Inglewood pool provides us. Stripping central neighbourhoods of essential amenities while increasing housing density will only lead to higher costs and problems down the road. **Pooling our resources**...the mayor of the Music Mile and Inglewood elder at large reflects on the pool closing...

Many of us made an interesting decision in our choice to live in the inner city. If you made that choice more than twenty years ago it was certainly a sketchy decision.

If many of our leaders and developers in those days had their way there would now be massive destruction of historic buildings and a four-lane freeway running through my neighborhood. It would be much like the CPR, still running ugly through the hood without any community contribution.

However, community warriors stepped up and the oil tanks were replaced by deer herds and slowly we became funky and popular. Artists and musicians were the new settlers. Even in this change, the voices of urban progress still wanted to tear down institutions like our old school.

So, the warriors made babies.

The babies needed to learn to swim and so they lobbied for a pool.

The babies grew and learned to swim and get along. Remarkably, our inner city, instead of slipping into the American style ghetto model, began to emerge from a sketchy cocoon into the much-desired butterfly of cool.

There was always music, art and funky commerce here and now more and more of our suburban neighbours are realizing they love artisan beer to mall beer and are bringing their dogs into Cold Garden

I spent my working life trying to save public institutions. In my early years I wanted to get rid of them but some hard work and elder sense made me realize that like an old Ford truck, we need to consider repairing our cherished and vintage institutions, not call for their demise.

We live in times where anger, mistrust, fear and bad information lead many to believe our institutions need to be taken out.

Public service, public safety, public education, public health and even public democracy, has some folks believing they are so broken we might need our own commercial real estate mogul and a slick car salesman to create a better new world.

I need convincing.

My old heart just wants to help fix the vintage.

The Music Mile is neither an organization or an institution. It is simply a place. There was always music here living, dancing and breathing life in old theatres, brick buildings and Quonset

huts. All we did when we started the Music Mile was shine a light and hook up some metaphorical speakers to what always existed.

It worked for the last ten years and so did the pool.

But funky quickly folds to finance, doesn't it? Commercial real estate now worth a few million dollars can easily crush a Quonset.

And a swimming pool.

Just pull the plug and bring in the dozers and say good bye to soul and laps.

It's always heartbreaking to see any community that thrives on music, art, dogs, kids, parks and good food fight for its life. But all those things do not really have high profit margins, do they?

It's not a fair fight as we see when a swimming hole or a music venue is worth millions.

To end more positive, we have seen hybrid victories in our hood, where vintage met contemporary and survived. The King Eddy was classic vintage with dirty blues, Export A smoke and Saturday afternoon harmony. The numbers guys saw it as a teardown, but I would love to shake the hands of those folks who convinced the developers to hand bomb the vintage Eddy brick by brick and load it back up with fine music once again running through its veins.

Excuse me, the pool is also vintage.

The pool is community.

However, the pool is sitting on millions of dollars worth of commercial real estate.

It will either go down like a vintage Quonset or be integrated back into the community like the treasure it is.

I can swim under water pretty good but I am not holding my breath.

I am writing to you this morning with a heavy heart. I am aware of the City's plans to close Inglewood swimming pool. This will have devastating consequences for the community. Children and seniors will not drive through downtown to access other facilities. Their fitness levels will fall, their social engagement will fall, and you might as well encourage them to eat more deep-fried foods. The overall negative effect on their general health will be about the same.

I have spent my entire cardiology career trying to prevent heart attacks and strokes. Encouraging people to obtain regular physical activity and exercise is crucial to realizing that goal. When people live in a community where they can easily obtain daily physical activity, this goal is relatively easily obtained. However, in a recent study published in Canada, Calgary ranked amongst the least friendly physical activity friendly communities in North America. We love cars. Not swimming, cycling, and walking. Closing pools is not the answer.

If you vote to close this pool, or other community exercise and physical activity facilities, you are driving nails into coffins. And you can watch with pride, as the mortality rates in these communities rise in the coming years. Vote as you think best. But do not delude yourselves into thinking that closing community facilities will benefit the mental, physical, or social health of the residents and voters who live in those communities.

Why? We have a rapidly expanding community and need services now and into the future, and closing services is exactly the opposite of supporting Cal- gaey's long term recreation plan, with the Inglewood Pool meeting several of the long term recreation goals. Personally, as a disabled individual small facilities make it possible for me to attend, large facilities such as MNP, YW Seton, etc. are a significant barrier and, really, are inaccessible for me (from lack of parking (theres never enough nor a guarantee of accessible stalls), to the physical effort just to get to the pool, too large of distances to navigate such as change rooms, and higher admission prices). Leaving the pool open allows for the oppurtunity to have local swim classes for children enrolled at the Colonel Walker and Piitoaysis School, a crucial life saving skill, and removing the barriers to classes for students, as there are not nearly enough city run swim classes, and its very difficult, if not often impossible, to enroll children in the the classes, and makes it easy for parents to have their children attend swim classes - I had this experience when, in Grade 7, I would walk to the Renfrew pool for swim classes during school hours, a fond memory. By not investing in the pool, the city has created a situation where the pool is not as busy as it could be. Upgrades such as a hot tub would significatly increase the user experience, especially in my case as I get very cold quickly, alongside children or other adults or seniors like me that need a body of warm water to offset the cooler water. Its a classic defund model, short sighted, and indicates lack of leadership for smaller, accessible recreation facilities in the city. Thank you for your time.

- I have spent my entire cardiology career trying to prevent heart attacks and strokes. Encouraging people to obtain regular physical activity and exercise is crucial to realizing that goal. However, in a recent study published in Canada, Calgary ranked amongst the least friendly physical activity friendly communities in North America. We love cars. Not swimming, cycling, and walking. Closing pools is not the answer.

#### **Re: Planned Closure of Inglewood Pool**

#### Dear Council,

I am writing to express my strong support for reconsidering the planned closure of Inglewood Pool. With a long history in aquatic sports, I understand the importance of such facilities. While I acknowledge the constraints that may make keeping the pool open long-term infeasible, I urge the Council to keep it open at least until the MNP expansion is complete and fully operational.

As a member of the Calgary Nomads Masters Swimming, a club operating out of Inglewood Pool, the closure would likely mean the end of our club. We have around 40 members, and no other reasonable options are available for our current timeslot. The City is investing heavily in the MNP expansion but is unwilling to allocate a relatively small amount to keep Inglewood open temporarily.

The closure of inner-city pools and athletic facilities without replacements impacts urban densification and increases traffic and costs. Swimming is a life-saving skill, especially in a city like Calgary, and the lack of accessible swimming lessons poses a risk. High-performance athletes start in municipal facilities, and fewer places to start a sport will lead to fewer athletes.

Facilities like Inglewood Pool serve as community hubs, helping people integrate into the city. I urge the Council to reconsider the closure and grant Inglewood Pool a temporary reprieve until the MNP expansion can accommodate the loss.
