Police Information Check (PIC) Disclosure

Information disclosed in a PIC1:

- Criminal Records Adult and Youth (includes indictable, dual procedure and summary conviction offences).
- Pending and outstanding charges.
- Outstanding warrants for arrest Canada-wide.
- Police Files/Information Reports: Relevant occurrences this may include any
 interactions an individual has had with police as being disclosed, including mental health
 occurrences, if they are deemed to be relevant. A relevant occurrence may not have
 resulted in charges being laid but will be disclosed if relevant or there is a potential risk
 to public safety.
- Records of not criminally responsible by reasons of Mental Disorder pursuant to s.16(1) cc (disclosed if relevant).
- Judicial Orders while in effect: probations, prohibitions, peace bonds and recognizance conditions.
- Vulnerable Sector Records (pardoned sex offender).
- Absolute Discharge for one-year period.
- Stay of Proceedings for one-year period.
- Conditional Discharge for three-year period.
- Alternative Measures for one-year period.

Information not disclosed in a PIC²:

- Mental health related occurrences unless determined that the individual is a threat to public safety.
- Convictions where a record suspension/pardon has been granted including sexual
 offences; unless a vulnerable sector check process was completed accordingly, and
 disclosure authorized by Minister of Public Safety.
- Information from the Alberta Motor Vehicle Automated Registration Information System, such as traffic violations or roadside driving suspensions.
- Suspect information that would hinder/compromise an ongoing investigation.
- Special Interest to Police Canadian Police Information Centre (CPIC) entries.
- Information not contained in police occurrence reports (i.e., Street Check Reports).
- Information from foreign law enforcement agencies.
- Foreign dispositions included on an identification databank (CRII) unless identified as international transfer of offenders.
- Victim, complainant, or witness information.
