Ward Boundary Commission - Revised Recommendations

PURPOSE

This report responds to Council's 2024 September 17 direction to request the Council Services Committee forward a revised set of Ward Boundary Commission recommendations for Council's consideration and implementation no later than the end of Q2, 2025.

HIGHLIGHTS

- In keeping with Bylaw 28M2023, a Ward Boundary Commission ("the Commission") was appointed in 2023 with a mandate to review and provide recommendations to Council on the effectiveness of the 14-ward system with no change to the number of Councillors and the Ward Boundary Determination and Review Policy.
- The Commission's 16 recommendations organized within 5 sections are detailed in their 2024 September 17 report to Council (Attachment 2).
- Administration's Preliminary Analysis of Service and Financial Impacts accompanied the Commission's 2024 September 17 report (Attachment 3).
- Attachment 4 is a Reference Document outlining:
 - o Commission recommendations by report section,
 - o Page references to Attachment 2 and 3, and
 - Status of recommendations (new opportunity for Council to consider, aligns with existing work under way by Administration, or administrative housekeeping).
- As set out in Attachment 3, some of the Commission's recommendations can be supported within the existing (2023- 2026) budget, where others require consideration in the next (2027-2030) budget cycle. Some recommendations will require further analysis to determine service and financial implications.

DISCUSSION

Between 2024 December 8 and 13, Members of Council were invited by Administration to complete a survey (Attachment 1) to:

- 1. Assist the Council Services Committee to prioritize the Commission's recommendations.
- 2. Gather feedback on refining the Commission's recommendations.
- 3. Identify recommendations that may need further clarification.

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The survey focused on recommendations representing new opportunities for Council to consider and those which align with existing work under way by Administration. Recommendations representing administrative housekeeping were not included in the survey.
