Planning and Development Services Report to Calgary Planning Commission 2025 February 27

Land Use Amendment in Banff Trail (Ward 7) at 2636 Capitol Hill Crescent NW, LOC2024-0296

RECOMMENDATION:

That Calgary Planning Commission recommend that Council:

Give three readings to the proposed bylaw for the redesignation of 0.07 hectares \pm (0.16 acres \pm) located at 2636 Capitol Hill Crescent (Plan 2846GW, Block 5, Lot 7) from Residential – Grade-Oriented Infill (R-CG) District to Housing – Grade Oriented (H-GO) District.

RECOMMENDATION OF THE CALGARY PLANNING COMMISSION, 2025 FEBRUARY 27:

That Council give three readings to **Proposed Bylaw 61D2025** for the redesignation of 0.07 hectares ± (0.16 acres ±) located at 2636 Capitol Hill Crescent (Plan 2846GW, Block 5, Lot 7) from Residential – Grade-Oriented Infill (R-CG) District to Housing – Grade Oriented (H-GO) District.

HIGHLIGHTS

- This application seeks to redesignate the subject site to allow for a variety of housing forms where the dwelling units may be attached or stacked within a shared building or cluster of buildings.
- The proposal represents an appropriate density increase of a residential site, allows for development that is compatible with the character of the existing neighbourhood and is in keeping with the applicable policies of the *Municipal Development Plan* (MDP) and the *Banff Trail Area Redevelopment Plan* (ARP).
- What does this mean to Calgarians? The proposed land use amendment would allow for greater housing choices within the community and a more efficient use of existing infrastructure and nearby amenities.
- Why does this matter? The proposed Housing Grade Oriented (H-GO) District would allow for more housing options that may better accommodate the evolving needs of different age groups, lifestyles, and demographics.
- No development permit has been submitted at this time.
- There is no previous Council direction related to this proposal.

DISCUSSION

This land use amendment application in the northwest community of Banff Trail was submitted by Calgreen Homes on behalf of the landowner, Marilyn June Feddersen on 2024 December 6. No development permit has been submitted at this time; however as noted in the Applicant Submission (Attachment 2) the applicant identified the intent to build grade-oriented townhouses, consisting of six dwelling units with secondary suites.

The approximately 0.07 hectare (0.16 acre) mid-block parcel is located on Capitol Hill Crescent NW, approximately 500 metres (an eight-minute walk) southeast of the University LRT Station.

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The University of Calgary, McMahon Stadium and several recreational and sports facilities are all within short walking distance from the site.

The proposed H-GO District accommodates grade-oriented development in a range of housing forms where dwelling units may be attached or stacked in a form and at a scale consistent with low density residential districts. A detailed planning evaluation of the application, including location maps and site context, is provided in the Background and Planning Evaluation (Attachment 1).

Applicant-Led Outreach

As part of the review of the proposed land use amendment application, the applicant was encouraged to use the <u>Applicant Outreach Toolkit</u> to assess which level of outreach with the public/interested parties and respective community association was appropriate. In response, the applicant contacted the Ward 7 Councillor's Office and the Banff Trail Community Association and delivered postcards to 30 nearby neighbours. A phone line and email inbox were also provided to allow interested neighbours to submit their comments or inquiries. The Applicant Outreach Summary can be found in Attachment 3.

City-Led Outreach

In keeping with Administration's practices, this application was circulated to the public/interested parties, notice posted on-site and published <u>online</u>. Notification letters were also sent to adjacent landowners.

No public comments were received at the time of writing this report. No comments from Banff Trail Community Association were received. Administration contacted the Community Association to follow up and no response was received.

Following Calgary Planning Commission, notifications for a Public Hearing of Council for the land use amendment will be posted on-site and mailed out to adjacent landowners. In addition, Commission's recommendation and the date of the Public Hearing will be advertised.

IMPLICATIONS

Social

The proposed H-GO District would allow for a wider range of housing types than the existing land use district and may better accommodate the housing needs of different age groups, lifestyles and demographics.

Environmental

This application does not include any actions that specifically address the objectives of the *Calgary Climate Strategy – Pathways to 2050.* Further opportunities to align future development

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on this site with applicable climate strategies will be explored and encouraged at subsequent development approval stages.

Economic

The proposed land use would allow for a more efficient use of land, existing infrastructure and services and provide more compact housing in the community.

Service and Financial Implications

No anticipated financial impact.

RISK

There are no known risks associated with this proposal.
