

Current State

- Public interest is increasing
- Enhanced Maintenance and Infrastructure Agreements Policy (CSPS007) is outdated and restrictive
- Limited ability to be flexible or meet customer requests





Why change the model?

Current model

- Limited groups able to participate
- Limited options for agreement types
- Difficult to make any program changes

Future model

- Flexibility to enter into agreements with more types of groups
- Flexibility to create new types of agreements
- Easier to adjust programs to better meet Calgarians' needs


