# Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) Update - April 2025 (Verbal)

#### Recommendation

That the Intergovernmental Affairs (IGA) Committee recommend that Council receive this verbal report and distribution for the Corporate Record.

## FCM Committee of the Whole and Board of Director Meetings – 2025 March 19-21 Dorval

- FCM committee and Board of Directors met virtually and in person to discuss policy resolutions that will be presented at the upcoming FCM annual general meeting in late May.
- Committee and board members also discussed the Canada-US trade war, its impacts on local businesses and how municipalities could help by leveraging municipal procurement and working on a Team Canada approach.
- FCM committee members also discussed the possibility of a spring election and advocacy messaging for municipal priorities.

#### Federal Election Campaign

- FCM launched its advocacy campaign in late March, focusing on the creation of a National Prosperity Partnership with all levels of government.
- Sharing messages about local communities and the foundation of Canada's economic growth and investing in local communities create national prosperity.
- The key asks for all federal parties to focus on local economic growth and resilience, infrastructure renewal, housing affordability, addressing homelessness, community safety and investing in climate-resilient infrastructure.

## FCM Activities - Defending Canada's Local Economies

- FCM continues to leverage relationships with US mayors and associations to emphasize the negative economic impact of trade policies.
- Key messages are tailored to each US region depending on the local implications, and US municipal leaders are asked to speak with their federal officials.
- Big City Mayors' Caucus members are working to share ideas, leverage connections, advocating for their regions and promoting local initiatives.
