Background and Previous Council Direction

Background

Connect: Calgary's Parks Plan replaces the Open Space Plan, which was approved by Council in 2002. Connect provides modernized policies and an operational framework to address the needs of Calgarians by supporting mental and physical health, conserving the environment, fostering community building and celebrating cultural landscapes.

Although no formal Council direction has been given to develop *Connect*, the plan addresses several Council priorities and updates parks policy to ensure alignment with municipal and provincial legislation, as well as best practices. *Connect* is a city-wide policy plan and supports the implementation of parks-related policies within the Municipal Development Plan (MDP).

Previous Council Direction

The table below outlines the Council direction for the Open Space Plan, approved in 2002, which has guided Administration's policies and operational actions proposed in *Connect: Calgary's Parks Plan*.
