Previous Council direction

- On 2023 July 4, Council approved
 RouteAhead and directed Administration to
 return annually with a RouteAhead Annual
 Status Report
- On 2025 March 11, Council passed a Notice of Motion directing Administration to respond to transit suggestions as an appendix to the RouteAhead annual update




Recommendations

That Infrastructure and Planning Committee recommend that Council:

- 1. Approve a one-time investment of \$3 million in 2025 from the Fiscal Stability Reserve for Calgary Transit to respond to growth pressures; and
- 2. Direct Administration to prioritize the RouteAhead 10-Year Implementation Plan through the 2026 budget adjustments.



Calgary's Primary Transit Network today


- Easy access for 160,000 Calgarians

Funding transit

Minding the RouteAhead gap

- Calgary's population grew by over 90,000, yet we have the same number of buses and trains
- We have limited ability to introduce more service to more Calgarians in a growing city
- There's a growing gap between operating costs and revenues





Closing the RouteAhead gap – the next 10 years

- Operating:
 - \$15M/year for fast and frequent service
- Capital:
 - \$45M/year for new bus purchases
 - \$500M for a new maintenance and storage facility



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
