## **Background and Previous Council Direction**

## Background

Discussion around the impacts of hail on private property initiated in 2020 following the 2020 June 13 hail event: at that time, the costliest hail event to occur in Calgary. Since then, there have been two other hail events (e.g. 2021 and 2024) that have significantly impacted Calgarians. The 2024 hail event is now the costliest storm in Calgary's history, with an estimated \$3.2B of insured losses, \$1.8B in private property damages, and close to 60,000 homes damaged.

The City of Calgary responded to the 2020 hailstorm by providing financial relief in the form of a resilient roofing rebate of \$3,000 for households who experienced damage in 2020, in the absence of provincial support. During the second round of resilient roofing program funding, it was expanded to provide a rebate for any homeowner who either experienced damage in the 2021 event and wanted to replace their roof with resilient materials. This program closed in 2022 due to the program fulfilling its purpose and achieving its goals.
