





Municipal Complex Structural Deficiencies


The engineering consultant noticed that Truss 'A' was constructed differently from what is shown on the original design;

Upon further investigation it was determined that the truss as built did not meet the life safety requirements of the Alberta Building Code.






Municipal Complex Structural Deficiencies (Cont'd)





Municipal Emergency Plan Activation

To ensure employee and public safety ALT activated The City's Municipal Emergency Plan (MEP) and Emergency Operations Centre (EOC)





Impacts to City Employees and Services

Administration's Response

Restored impacted front facing City services including City Cashiers reopening within 24 hours and the Fair Entry and Tax Counters within 72 hours.

Ensured all relocated employees were accommodated to meet their shortterm space and technology needs within the first week of the emergency event.

Installed on Truss 'A', 'B' and in the Administration building









The Municipal Complex lost 257,893 square feet or 27 per cent of floor space during the upgrade.

Building Upgrade Impacts



Building Safety

The Municipal and Administration building now exceed the Alberta Building Code standards.



Space Efficiency

Increase in usable office space on floors 8 thru 12 by 38 per cent.



Future Savings

The Municipal Complex Structural Upgrade has a resulting future cost avoidance of \$6.6 Million.



Re-occupancy Completion

Administration has completed 99.1 per cent of the reoccupancy to affected areas.





Recommendations

Administration recommends that:

That the Priorities and Finance Committee recommends:

That Council approve the transfer of \$12.2 million in project costs to be spent in 2017 and 2018 to the Corporate Cost Program 861 for the Municipal Complex Structural Upgrade.
