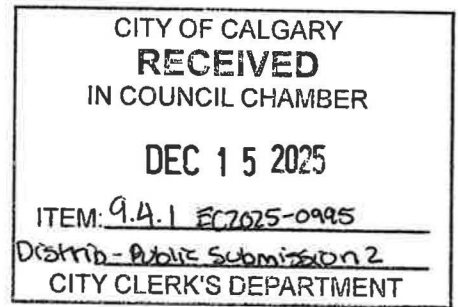

The concerns our family has regarding the blanket re-zoning, including some of the “15 minute city” ideas floated for Calgary, ignore many factors that are well documented in your files. The repeal should also carefully exam approvals that ignored the frustration of community members, where 8 unit (4 x 2) permits were granted in traditional single family neighborhoods. The rights of a community to enjoy the environment they chose to live, should not be easily amended. In the name of administrative convenience, we often forget that there are real people at the other end of the policy. With many working from home (looking for lower cost housing), Calgary could extend its hand to supporting our bedroom communities and help to expand our environs rather than focussing on density.
