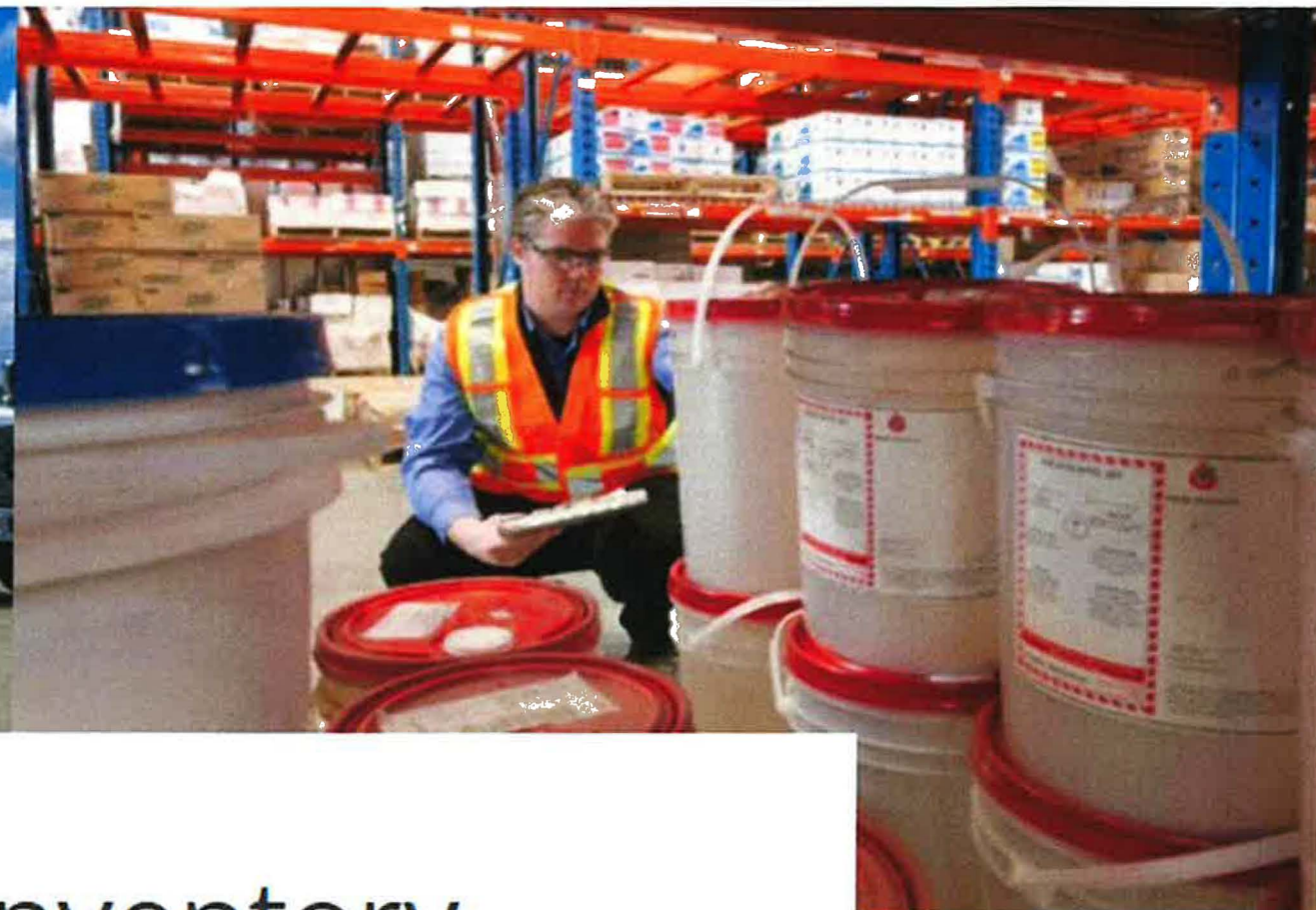
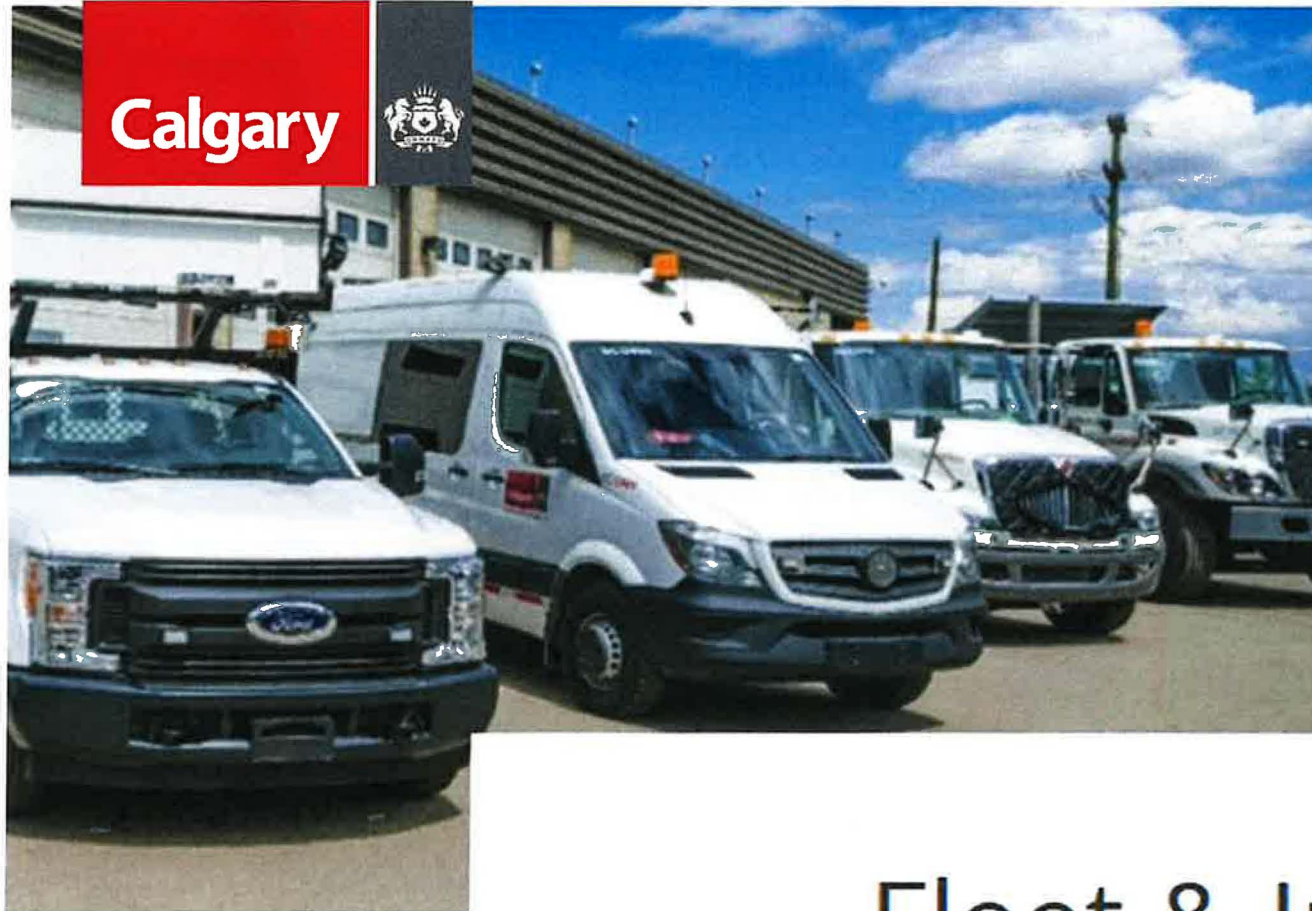

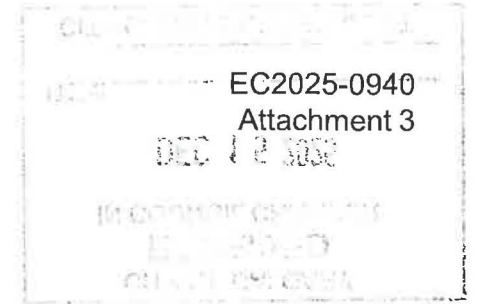

2. Give first reading to Bylaw 8B2025 (Attachment 2), being the proposed bylaw authorizing The City to borrow up to the maximum amount of \$52.5 million for financing the acquisition of vehicles and equipment; and
3. Withhold second and third readings of the attached proposed Bylaw 8B2025 until the advertising requirements set out in the Municipal Government Act, RSA 2000, c. M-26, have been met.

## Highlights:

- New borrowing to support Fleet & Inventory's capital budget increase, approved by Council in the November 2025 Mid-Cycle Adjustments
- New fleet vehicles to support growth by public facing business units and reduce service disruptions and repair costs
- Requesting authority to borrow up to a maximum of \$52.5 million to finance the acquisition of vehicles and equipment
- Fleet & Inventory operates on a self-supported financing model with recoveries from service departments and business units through lease charges
- Service departments and business units obtain their funding from sources such as property taxes or user fees as approved in the November 2025 operating budgets
