- 2. \$620,000 budget appropriation, funding from Corporate Properties and Buildings Reserved for Future Capital Reserve to Program 768 Heritage Buildings Rehabilitation.
- 3. \$50,000 budget appropriation, funding from Corporate Properties and Buildings Reserved for Future Capital Reserve to Program 768 Heritage Buildings Rehabilitation.
- 4. Realignment of \$747,000 from Program 770 City-owned Downtown Buildings-Public Building to Program 768 Heritage Buildings Rehabilitation.
- 5. Realignment of \$1,438,000 from Program 880, Municipal Complex Optimization to Program 768, Heritage Buildings Rehabilitation.
- 6. Realignment of \$1,500,000 from Program 880, Building Envelope Projects to Program 768 Heritage Buildings Rehabilitation.

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7. Realignment of \$750,000 from Program 937 Municipal Complex Site Drainage Program to Program 768 Heritage Buildings Rehabilitation.
