**Sections of Police Act governing Commission Accountabilities**

29(1) Every Commission in consultation with the chief of police, shall cause to be prepared (a) estimates of all money required for the fiscal year to pay the remuneration of the police officers and other persons employed for the police service, and provide an pay for the maintenance of accommodation equipment and operating costs of the police service and (b) a yearly plan specifying the level of police service and programs to be provided in respect to the municipality and shall submit those estimates and plans to the council	31(1) Where a commission has been established, the commission shall, in the carrying out of its responsibilities, oversee the police service and for that purpose shall do the following: (i) establish policies providing for efficient and effective policing (ii) provide liaison between the commission or policing committee and the chief, and perform the duties assigned by the Commission of policing complaints.
