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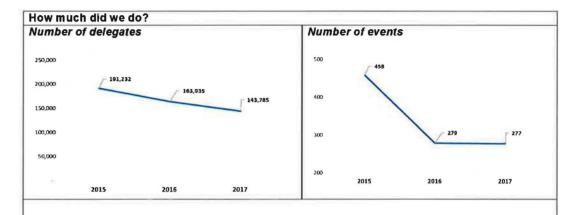


2017 Accomplishments

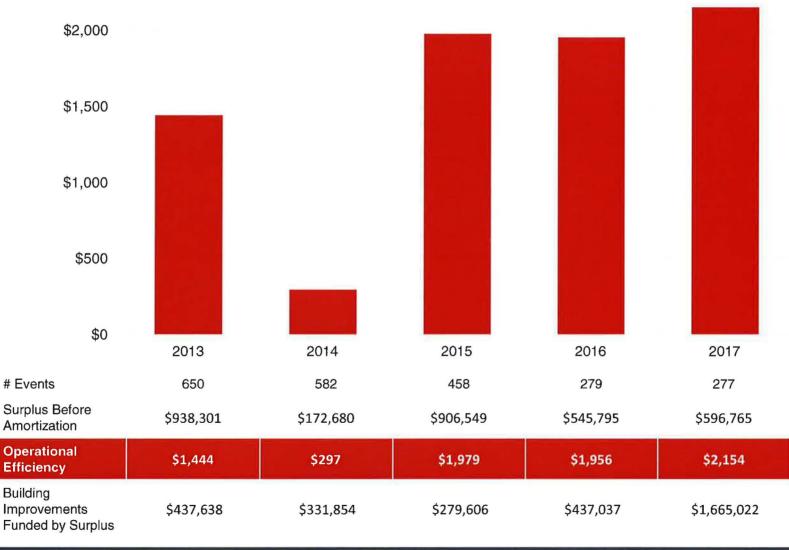

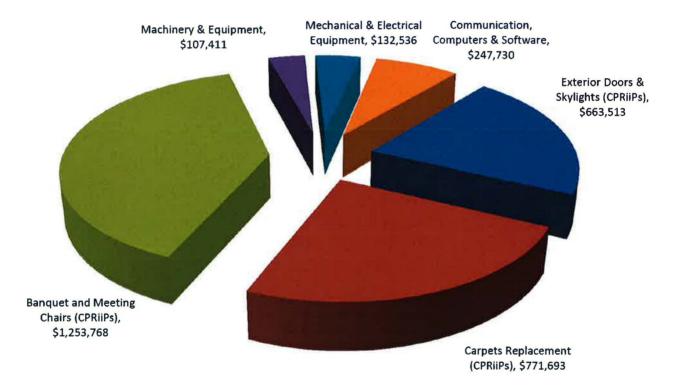

 - > Ambassadors + Client Servicing

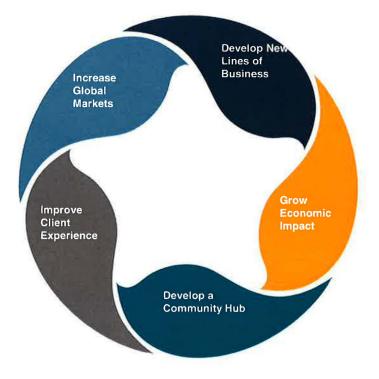
Calgary 2017 Accomplishments – Capital Expenditures
