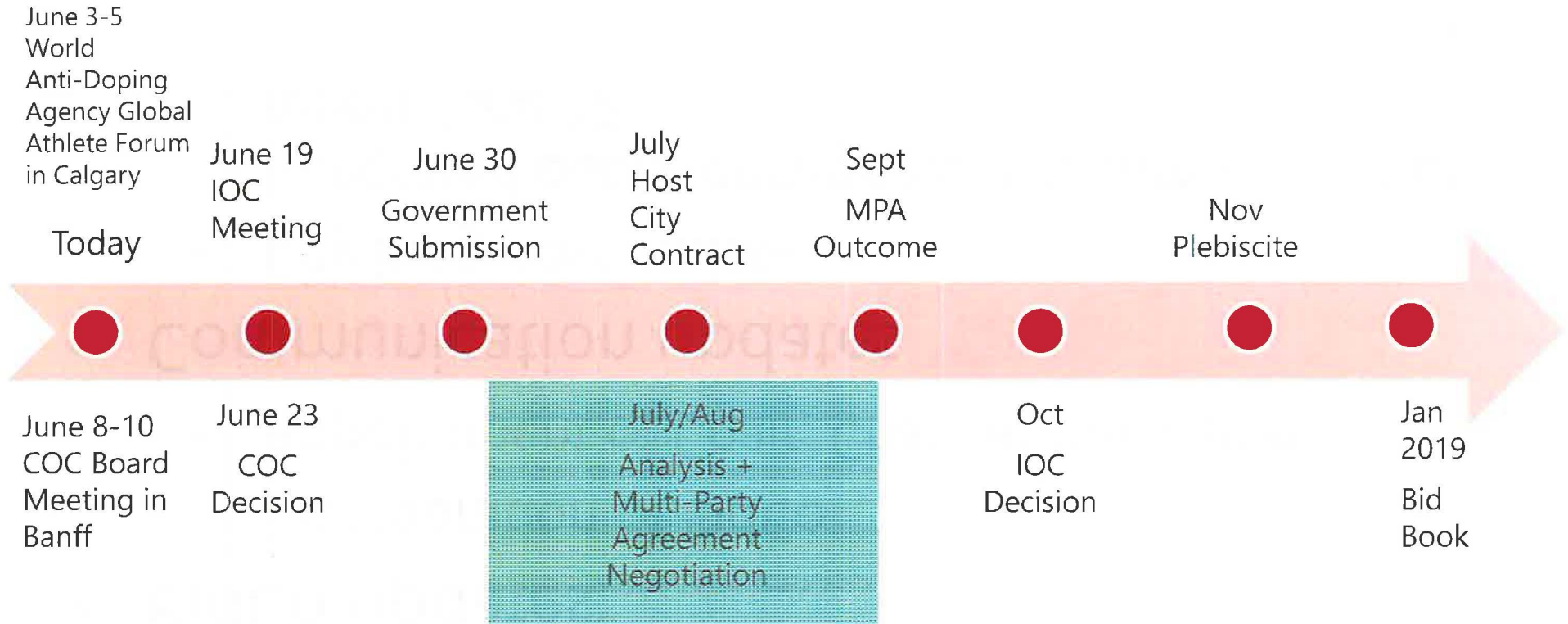

# Background

## Background

- Calgary Bid Exploration Committee oversaw Exploration Stage from November 2016 through July 2017
- Administration presented CBEC report (Feasibility Study and Conceptual Master Hosting Plan) to City Council on July 31 2017
- Section 4 of CBEC report includes Master Facilities Plan overview
- That report formed the basis of the draft Games Concept



## Background

- CBEC developed Concept in accordance with seven guiding principles:
  - Maximize the reuse of facilities
  - Effectively leverage facilities
  - Meet all technical specifications for hosting the OPWG
  - Mitigate adverse impacts to residents and region's environment
  - Cluster venues
  - Balance between legacy and affordability
  - Alignment with IOC Olympic Agenda 2020

## Background continued

- Administration and Bid Development team have continued to refine the Concept
- Stakeholders include all orders of government, Town of Canmore, athletes, International Olympic Committee, Canadian Olympic Committee, International Paralympic Committee, Canadian Paralympic Committee and venue owners



## Legacy of 1988 Games

- Calgary, Bow Valley region have proven facilities like COP, Olympic Oval, Nakiska, Canmore Nordic Centre
- Venues continue to hold major international events like World Cups



# Refinement of Concept

## Background

- City of Calgary has managed OPWG project during Dialogue Stage since 2017
- Work to date:
  - Identifying and refining all preliminary venue options
  - Selecting venues based on established guiding principles and previous experience
  - Enlisting Games technical experts, architects, engineers
  - Enlisting surveyors to determine capital costs for venues

## Background

- Venues identified for majority of Olympic and Paralympic sports
- Administration has explored options but final decisions rest with Bid Corporation (BidCo)
- IOC visited Calgary in January 2018 for first Interactive Session
  - Games Concept was among agenda items discussed
