<i>Infrastructure Funding Working Group</i>	The City will continue to advocate for additional revenue sources to fund the additional costs of servicing growth.	AUMA will continue to advocate for expanded revenue authorities for municipalities. AUMA will create an opportunity for The City to obtain information on their Building Canada Fund application. AUMA will continue to advocate for municipal interests on the infrastructure funding working group including offsite levies.	Share: The City will continue to work with AUMA to advocate for more flexible funding mechanisms to fund growth-related infrastructure. AUMA will provide a letter of support for The City's Building Canada Fund application.
<i>Safety Codes Act</i>	The City will continue to advocate for the development of a new accreditation regulation to the Act.	AUMA will coordinate the development of advocacy positions on the Act, including matters related to accreditation formed by AUMA's membership on the Safety Codes Council.	Share: AUMA and The City will work together to identify mutual advocacy opportunities on the Act.
<i>Local Authorities Election Act</i>	The City will continue to advocate for the amendments recommended in 2011.	AUMA will refresh the legislative changes and any related policy improvements, submitting them to the province, and sharing them with AAMDC and the Alberta School Boards Association.	Share: The City and AUMA will continue to advocate for the remaining amendments and administrative improvements.
