Provincial Model with Additional Restrictions	
<p>Cannabis smoking would be prohibited:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">a) inside a building;b) on a patio;c) inside a public vehicle;d) on any hospital property, school property, child care facility property, campground, cemetery, golf course, ski hill or off-leash area;e) within 10 metres from a doorway, window or air intake of a building, patio, bus stop or a light rail transit terminalf) on or within 30 metres from:<ul style="list-style-type: none">i. a playground,ii. a sports field,iii. a skate park or bicycle park,iv. a zoo,v. an outdoor theatre,vi. an outdoor pool or water spray park,vii. a seasonal skating rink, org) within Sir Winston Churchill Square, Fort Edmonton Park, the John Janzen Nature Centre, the Edmonton Valley Zoo, or the Muttart Conservatory; andh) in an area designated as a no smoking area for cannabis.
